“How to Prevent the Next Nuclear War”

Thursday, August 22

On August 6, 1945, the United States used the world’s first nuclear weapon on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. Three days later, a second bomb was dropped on the city of Nagasaki. Together, the two bombings killed 129,000–226,000 people, most of whom were civilians. Today, there are nearly 14,000 nuclear weapons in just nine countries. Some of these modern nuclear weapons are more than 3,000 times as powerful as the bomb dropped on Hiroshima. That’s why three-quarters of the nations on Earth have called for totally eliminating them. This month, we will be viewing three short videos that explain the current status of nuclear weapons on our planet. We will review current legislation regarding nuclear weapons and provide an opportunity to take meaningful action to tell Congress to take steps to reduce the risk of nuclear war.
