Faith and Doubt

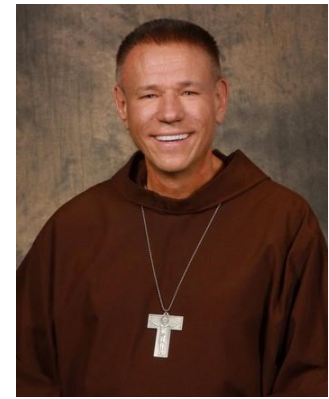
Addictions and Conversion
