# From the President

## UUCGT Board Meeting Summary for February

The UUCGT Board of Trustees met on Tuesday, February 19. Following are key items from the meeting.

- ♦ The Endowment Committee brought their annual distribution plan to the Board which was approved. Distribution was \$600 for Capital Improvement Reserve, \$600 for UUA activities and \$600 for Community Needs. The Board also voted to apply the \$600 for UUA to this year's UUA dues since there are ample funds reserved to provide scholarships for attendance at General Assembly.
- ♦ The Policy Committee brought a rewritten policy and procedure for the interface between the Leadership Development Committee and the Safe Congregation Team. The changes involved the timing of approvals of recommended Board, LDC and Endowment candidates. The changes were approved by the Board.
- ♦ The Board appointed Tom Darnton, Mike McDonald and Barb Termaat to the Interim Search Committee. The Board also will seek out a longer-term member to help with review of the Interim Application. Unlike the search for a Settled Minister, the UUA process for an Interim Search is a Board function. Our Interim Application must be completed by the end of March.
- ♦ Board President Mike McDonald reported on actions taken in the closed session following the January 22 Board meeting:
  - Approved change to Accountant position and hiring of Bookkeeper
  - Voted to begin a search for an Interim Minister to start in August
  - Voted to extend an offer to Rev. Beth Marshall to be our temporary Minister from March through July
  - Voted (via e-mail at the end of January) to approve a contract for Rev. Beth Marshall

We plan to share highlights from our monthly Board meetings throughout the year. You can also find the minutes of Board meetings on our website. Our Board meetings are open meetings and you are welcome to attend. Our next meeting is scheduled for **Tuesday, March 26 at 6:30 pm** in the Social Hall (please note date & time).

## Stewardship Team

This May, we will reach a milestone marking 55 years as a Unitarian Universalist Congregation (nee Fellowship). UUCGT history clearly shows that in spite of any and all obstacles along the way, our members have always persevered to keep moving forward...

## ***Building Momentum***

This year, we are, not for the first time in our history and not for lack of planning, at a financial crossroad. We had a good idea of where we were heading and were making good progress and then, as sometimes happens in life, unexpected events got in the way.

We find ourselves having to raise \$100,000 this year in order to attract a quality candidate for Interim Minister. Add to that expense another \$110,000 for other important staff positions, and yet another \$50,000 for operational expenses. With an additional \$15,000 for UUA and MidAmerica dues, we're faced with total expenses of \$275,000.

That's a lot of numbers, but what it all boils down to is this:

**We need \$34,000 more than last year's pledge total to meet our goals.**

Please pledge as if your fondest wishes for our congregation depend upon it. (*They do!*)

Our 55-year history sets the standard. Our founders showed what can be done when they dug deep to build what we enjoy today. We owe it to them and to ourselves to continue...

## SOCIAL JUSTICE

### What is Title X?

The “X” stands for ten in this case, nothing else. It is a government funded program signed into law in 1970 and is our nation’s family planning program. Title X funds insure quality family planning healthcare in more than 8,400 service sites in the U.S., serving over 4 million low-income people.

Title X recipient clinics are prohibited from funding abortion and always have been prohibited. It provides essential healthcare including pap smears; breast exams; testing and treatment for infections; birth control methods; vaccines; and in some settings permanent birth control and prenatal care. The goal of Title X is to assist people to plan for and space pregnancies proactively and reduce unplanned pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections. Vulnerable populations, including teens and people with low incomes, are a priority focus. Another focus is to give women, men and teens accurate healthcare information about sex, reproduction, LGBTQ, and disease prevention.

Planned Parenthood is the recipient of about 41% of Title X funding. Remember, Planned Parenthood has never performed abortions. But, they inform clients of that option if it is a medically appropriate option for her particular case.

Our national administration has promised to defund Planned Parenthood. Now, they have rewritten Title X so that funding will be denied to any clinic that even mentions the word abortion to any of its clients. This “gag rule” is a fight against women’s health care options, screening for cancer, etc, as stated above, and would affectively deny good health care for 4 million low-income women.

Budgeted income includes the total of all pledged and unpledged donations and miscellaneous income including building rent, etc.

“For Those in Need” collections are in addition to Budgeted Income Received and are disbursed quarterly to worthy causes, including Congregational Care, Tuesday Community Lunch and other Community needs outside our congregation.

The percentage reflects the portion of the total amount of income or expense budgeted for the fiscal year. \*There was a one time donation of \$5,000 to “For Those in Need” in December 2017 that did not repeat in 2018. We continue to be “in the black” for the 2018-2019 fiscal year largely due to significant pre-payment of 2018-2019 pledges and some temporary reduction in compensation expense due to staff turnover. If you have not pre-paid your pledge, please try to keep your pledge up to date. Chris and I have been members of UUCGT for about 4 1/2 years and have gotten to know a lot of you through many activities and committees available to us here at UUCGT. I originally volunteered to be the chairperson of this year's Pledge Drive, however due to a fire on January 4th at our home which resulted in major building and smoke damage, I had to step down. The Stewardship Team of Dave Halsted, Jan Zerbel, Penny Ort and Karl Keinath immediately stepped up and carried on. This was the beginning of the **Many Acts of Kindness** Chris and I have received from this congregation since that day and beyond.

Last year's pledge drive theme was "**Show–Up**". And **YOU** have been **Showing–Up** - helping to create and present Sunday Services, attending many community activities, actively participating in committee meetings and helping those in need. You reached out to Chris and me - asking how we were doing, providing meals and soup, sending heartfelt cards and messages of caring and concern, collecting bags of smoky laundry and returning plastic bins of clean, fresh-smelling clothing, gathering storage containers for us to store things in and offering places to stay. Your Showing–Up and expressing your **Kindness** has deeply touched us. **You have demonstrated the 7 Principles that are the foundation of Unitarian Universalism.**

As we continue this year's **BUILDING MOMENTUM Stewardship Pledge Drive**, Chris and I want to thank you for all you have done for us.
