MINISTER'S MESSAGE *from REV. ALEX*



Dear Ones,

When have you experienced “grace”? This sense of care and support that you don’t necessarily ask for or feel that you deserve, but it’s there anyway? Who in your life, or within this community, has been there for you in moments of real grace? Not as this supernatural experience, but as this real, practical experience of unconditioned lovingkindness?

I think a lot about how, for myself, grace was something I encountered when I started attending services at my home congregation in Fremont, California. I think about how it felt to be loved as I was, in a time when you’re told so many other painful messages as a teenager.

This was grace in how it met me where I was when I needed it. I couldn’t ask for this community to embrace me, but they took me in as one of their own anyway.

To this moment, my heart is still on fire from the love that they shared with me; extending to me a grace and pure sense

of love that convinced me that what we do in our congregations matters, and that I want to dedicate my life to this.

Though “grace” is a term with heavy connotations in Christianity, I struggle to find a word that better captures it. Certainly, grace doesn’t need to be this mercy extended to me on behalf of a deity. Instead, I notice grace in those moments of deepest humanity. The moments when we are called to be our better selves and we rise to the task. Grace is one of the things I’d argue Unitarian Universalists are fairly familiar with; it’s part of the air we breathe, in how we aspire to love and cherish the worth and dignity found in every human heart.

In this season of abundance, there are many who are hungry and without shelter who could use some grace. Instead of relying on divine guarantees, we as Unitarian Universalists understand that we, ourselves, are the ones to do the doing; the ones that must reach out and care for our neighbors.

Likewise, the upcoming holiday season serves as a reminder of this grace. We see it in gathering around tables laden with food. We notice it in our jubilance and our joy for the sharing of stories and laughter. We witness it in our own hearts, and the hearts of those we love—and those we hardly know—alike.

In this season of grace, I hope you will assist our hungry and unhoused neighbors at Safe Harbor in this time of greater need. Through this, we might glimpse yet more of the grace that we’ve already received, though we might not feel like we deserve. Let’s lavish this grace on a world that so needs it!

I'll say it straight. I am having issues. We used to use the word problems, but now they are called issues. Lots of things, issues, have changed. So much is happening that it is threatening our culture, our society, our supposed Democracy. Where are we going? Downhill? I read the first 1000 pages of the *Rise and Fall of the Third Reich*. Have you? Try it. We are on that same path! Why is our country so vulnerable to these influences? Why are we going there? And another; it is happening in many countries around the world. Why?

Is it jealousy and fear of losing their way of life that the minority of *White-Have-It-All's* fear? Is it realization that the rest of us are losing all opportunities to gain any of what the *Haves* have? What are the real causes and why? What can we do?

All the issues are Social Justice Issues. For example, the Rights to "Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness," since "all men are created equal" written in our Declaration of Independence by Thomas Jefferson, a slave holder.

Let's take the first Right, Life. I have a right to Life. The next person does too but maybe he feels he values some other Right even more than that for Life. So, he does not get vaccinated, not wear a mask. That is infringing on my Right to Life. We live in a society together! Doesn't he, all of us, have an obligation to follow the understood rules in our society that we all have the Right to Life. He may lose his, but does he have the right to impose that loss of Life on me?

Do we need two school systems? One would be for kids whose parents want to protect their kids from getting sick by having them wear a mask, from other kids whose parents feel not wearing a mask is more important than Life. I want the Right to Life, and a healthy one too, for my kids, all kids. And you want?

To vote is a constitutional Right. It is our responsibility really, an obligation. Some are afraid if they let others vote, that they will lose the vote and their privileges. Of course, they don't say it that way. They say they are protecting the vote from "fraud." Their fear is encroaching on my Rights! This is a special social justice issue because the *Haves* want to limit the vote of only certain targeted people, poor, people of color, immigrants, etc.

The list goes on and runs deep. What do we do? There is an old saying; if you "say nothing, then you are agreeing with the loudest voice." It is our obligation to speak up, act, protest, rally, write letters, call those supposedly in charge, make our voices heard! Join groups that do things like that so you have support and can be heard loud and clear: STOP, Save our Democracy!

Come to the SJA meetings and learn you are not alone; express how you think our UUCGT can help you and help save our Rights together. Thanks!

BOARD SUMMARY



Hello Friends.

Let's start with some good news.

Reported by our Treasurer, Tom, the preliminary report for fiscal year 2020/21 indicates we emerged with an \$18,000 surplus! There will be an accountant approved final report presented by our Financial Committee in the very near future.

The delay with this report, in part, was the switching of software systems and the absence of Guy in Aug and no one to cover for him. Your Board recognizes this problem, and is preparing a contingency plan for backup to cover for Guy when necessary.

On-going preparations for an eventual return to in-person Sunday Services continue.

- The Board approved “**Gathering Parameters**” for Music presented by Renee, Music Director.
- We also approved the ROTF current guidelines of masking by all who enter the Church.
- When services resume, attendees will notice temporary changes, such as a reduction of chairs in the sanctuary.

ROTF determined, due to recommended 6 ft. distancing, only 35 people can attend.

- There will not be any gathering within the Social Hall.
- Weather permitting, we can meet outside.
- When it appears all will be safe for this limited attendance, there will be more detailed information available.
- Rev. Alex and the Staff are requesting a month to prepare for our safe return.
- The Board has invited the ROTF on Oct. 27, to another Discernment Meeting to discuss the current Covid issues and what other area churches are doing.

Website updates:

- Mary Ann and Chris Lautz have been trained on the new website. They are working on bringing the site up to date, such as copies of the Board minutes, Board packets, and Beacon. They work at home using designated computers.
- Live streaming updates: Installation nearly complete, 6 lights for proper lighting, Ethernet cable to be installed under the carpet, and extensive training, from MusicHub.LIVE, for Rev Alex, Renee, Betsy, Geoff, Pam, Amanda, Mary Ann, and Chris L.

New Business:

- Leadership Development Committee has developed a new version of the job descriptions for Board members.
- Rev Alex and Pat attended a Zoom Service of the Benzie Fellowship. They were very welcoming and delighted to see Rev Alex. Pat is now on their Zoom list and will be attending more of their gatherings.

Financial Summary

***Income for 2020-2021 includes recognition of \$39,825 of income from the Payroll Protection Plan loan we obtained in spring of 2020. As this loan was forgiven by the Small Business Administration in May 2021 we are now recognizing the amount as income. The PPP loan was used to pay wages of our employees in 2020 and other allowable expenses. This income has resulted in a significant surplus for 2020-2021 which will ultimately be used to help balance our budget for 2021-2022.**

This final 2020-2021 report is three months late due to a number of factors including a six week absence of our Accountant, a software conversion, a change of ownership at our bank and a planned review by an outside accountant. A year to date report for fiscal 2021-2022 should be available next month. Rest assured, in the meantime, that income is being deposited, bills are being paid and our staff is being compensated.

It is significant to note that for the second straight year we have exceeded budgeted income and kept expenses slightly under budget resulting in surpluses both years. Thank you for your generosity that has made this possible.

Budgeted income includes the total of all pledged and unpledged donations and miscellaneous income including building rent, etc. "For Those in Need" collections are in addition to Budgeted Income Received and are disbursed quarterly to worthy causes, including Congregational Care, Tuesday Community Lunch and other Community needs outside our congregation. The percentage reflects the portion of the total amount of income or expense budgeted for the fiscal year.
