Sandra McDonald informed the Program Council that the **ReOpening Task Force (ROTF)** has been meeting and adjusting plans returning to in-person services. Stay tuned to the *Flash* as updates occur.

Here are some notes about that from the most recent Board meeting:

- The Board reports that the plan is to continue ZOOM services in July and start an in-person hybrid approach in August.
- New UUA guidelines state that when meeting indoors everyone should wear a mask because there are children and others who cannot be vaccinated.
- Our new website will support streaming live video for our hybrid services. It launches in June.
- Committees may meet inside the church now to prepare for reopening as long as total people inside are within guidelines (currently 25 people max).
- Cathy has suggested doing a a soft opening and that we do a trial run close to the time of Alex's first live service.





Eight members of the Program Council met for a short meeting on June 11, 2021. Minutes from the May 14th meeting were approved and have been forwarded to the Board. We decided to not meet in July so our next meeting will be Friday, August 13 at 3:00 PM via Zoom.

Renee reported VE will be meeting 4 times this summer for rehearsals in the parking lot at our standard times (Thursday evenings at 7:00 pm). The entire VE is looking forward to meeting and singing in person. When you see the announced times, put it on your calendar and come join us.

Sandra informed us the ReOpening Task Force (ROTF) has been meeting and adjusting plans returning to inperson services. Stay tuned to the Flash as updates occur. All are looking forward to returning to services in the sanctuary when protocols allow and our system to run dual (Zoom and In-Person) services is established. She also reported that Community Needs had distributed \$500 to 10 different organizations. Thanks for all the continued contributions to the For our Neighbors side of the virtual basket.

Chris Lautz indicated Membership is still working on a NEW Directory and starting to plan a New Member Welcoming Celebration in late summer.

Amanda reported both Sunday Services are planning a celebration for Cathy's last service (June 20) and services for July while we wait for Alex to arrive in August. Congregational Care continues caring for members of the congregation in need. Both of these two committees need additional members to fully support their important functions, so please **volunteer**!

Rick reviewed Stewardship Team had received over \$220,000 from the pledge drive. This was short of our original goal, however expect additional pledges to continue to come in. When we return to having an open building, additional revenues will return from groups such as the Bridge Group and Indivisible.

## Reflections on our Journey - Part 3

I was not sure what I was getting into when I was asked to be on the Ministerial Search Committee even though I was advised to take a sabbatical from my other committees. This is not a committee, it is a journey that includes learning about UU principles, UU folks throughout the country, UUCGT & ourselves on the Team. I knew my compadres were wonderful people. They have exceeded my expectations in skills, creativity, willingness to take on tasks and listen. I did not know how much they would teach me, hold me, and be kind when I needed to

be reined in.

The beginning felt chaotic. UUA has its own language and a huge book of RULES & SCARY TIMELINES. Duolingo does not have a course in UUAese.

First, we had to let the world know who UUCGT is.

We scoured our history to tell of our journey starting with the first group to educate their kids, to the fellowship and finally to a mature congregation.

We wrote about our triumphs, growth, the building, the caring

for each other and sometimes the pain that occurred.

We told how we love and try to make our place on earth a little better. We let people know that UUCGT folks have beauty, creativity, compassion, sometimes conflict, and joy, especially when we sing. We surveyed, had meetings, pulled together data, created documents, helped fix the website, and bundled it all to UUA.

Then we had to figure out who they were: Ministerial candidates who had reams of information, sermons, references, goals and passions. We had to research their individual meanings in theology and life experiences. Eight interviews of diverse, creative people. We narrowed it down to three. We extensively shared a weekend with each.

- One was caring, launching out into settled ministry.
- One was on an intense journey of human interaction.
- One was a bright light who joyously ministered to us in the process.

Now we are presenting a very special person to UUCGT. NEW BEGINNINGS. For me that started spiritually with my team 9 months ago.

In the process of acquainting them with our congregation and our geographical area, I became more completely enamored with it all myself. And this TEAM! Above all, I feel proud that we attained our goal of bringing to UUCGT the best possible candidate to join us in our important mission going forward for years to come.










## We Say Goodbye to Rev Cathy .... continued

## **UUCGT Board Meeting Summary**



The June Board meeting is the one time a year when the new Board members join the full current Board to support a smooth transition at the end of our fiscal year. While our agenda had updates on items in progress, there was also much excitement for what's ahead and a few tears for major transitions--especially as it was the last Board meeting with Rev Cathy. She says she'll be giving us a well-deserved positive report with the UUA. We did all required tasks to prepare for a new minister, and cooperated and worked together well in the process!

### **Financial Updates**

Our \$39K PPP loan has been forgiven by the SBA. We will show a profit of \$45K for the year (even without the PPP!). To improve office processes, we will obtain a bank safety deposit box for important records and documents and switch to Quickbooks for accounting and Breeze for our members database starting in July. An accountant will train Guy on the new systems and do an accounting review. We also agreed to pay for Guy to take an accounting class at NMC.

#### **Re-opening Task Force**

Cathy suggested a soft opening and that we do a trial run close to the time of Alex's first live service. We plan to continue ZOOM services in July and start an in-person hybrid approach in August. Joe Cook will continue to make adjusted guidelines as conditions change--thanks Joe! We are currently at level B. Cathy said the new UUA guidelines state that when meeting indoors everyone should wear a mask because there are children and others who cannot be vaccinated. Committees can start meeting inside the church now to prepare for reopening as long as total people inside are within guidelines (currently 25 people max).

### **Preparing for Alex**

Cathy informed us that we will need to have a "startup" board retreat with our new minister facilitated by a UU person (likely Lisa Pressley) to create a covenant and set goals--Likely in Sept/Oct timeframe. The Committee on Ministry is a mix of board selected and minister selected members who must do an annual review of our ministry for 3 years during the fellowshipping period (and should continue annually thereafter).

### **Stewardship Update**

This year's pledge team is done! Pledges totalling \$216K were received with about 20 people who gave previously hopefully coming in soon. Karl recommends we nominate a new team soon so they can start preparations early this Fall.

### **UUCGT Website Refresh / Streaming capability**

Our new website will launch in June! It will support streaming live video for our hybrid services, but we are looking into concerns regarding Facebook streaming security and improving our wiring for new technology. Geoff Norman-Anderson has volunteered to be our "streamer" -- we now have a very knowledgeable tech team with Geoff, Renee, Betsy, Marco and Alex! The board also passed a resolution to seek a closed captioning service to make our services as broadly accessible as possible.

<sup>\*</sup>Income for 2020-2021 includes recognition of \$39,825 of income from the Payroll Protection Plan loan we obtained in spring of 2020. As this loan was forgiven by the Small Business Administration in May 2021 we are now recognizing the amount as income. The PPP loan was used to pay wages of our employees in 2020 and other allowable expenses. This income will result in a significant surplus for 2020-2021 which will ultimately be used to help balance our budget for 2021-2022.

Budgeted income includes the total of all pledged and unpledged donations and miscellaneous income including building rent, etc. "For Those in Need" collections are in addition to Budgeted Income Received and are disbursed quarterly to worthy causes, including Congregational Care, Tuesday Community Lunch and other Community needs outside our congregation. The percentage reflects the portion of the total amount of income or expense budgeted for the fiscal year.

We need your continued help. If you can, send your pledge payments and "for those in need" contributions to the office or contribute on-line at uucgt.org. It is time to pay your 2020-2021 pledge in full if you have not already done so.
