Ellie Smith relayed information about how the Endowment Committee receives funds, that it grew by \$3,800 in May and that they will be sending an informational letter and survey out to the congregation in the fall after the full member and friends list is updated. OUR HEALTHY CONGREGATION



A Message from the Healthy Congregations Team (HCT)

We've achieved some major 2021 milestones! Rev Alex is with us now and we are gradually meeting more frequently in person. As exciting as this all is, with changes we naturally may experience anxiety. Next month on October 3rd, the HCT will be supporting the Sunday service on Cultivating Relationship to help us connect our covenant to each other with how we respond to a circumstance that we have issues with.

"A healthy congregation is one that actively and responsibly addresses its anxious disturbances, rather than a congregation with an absence of troubles."

A healthy congregation is one that actively and responsibly addresses its anxious disturbances, rather than a congregation with an absence of troubles. Thinking of our congregation as a system, we realize that a change in one part affects other parts of the group--similar to an ecosystem in nature. Thus deciding to respond thoughtfully vs. reacting automatically can be your contribution to the health of your family, group, congregation or community!

Taken from our UUCGT Healthy Congregation Procedure, let's refresh our memory of what we agreed we should do when we feel anxious or upset with someone.

- Talk directly with the person (member, Minister, staff) with whom you have the conflict.
- Anonymous complaints are not acceptable. Own the issue.
- Examine your role in the conflict. Why is this matter important to you? Get clear in your mind what happened and why. Write your thoughts down.
- Email is not an acceptable means of communication in a time of conflict.
- As soon as possible after the incident, agree on a mutually acceptable time and place to talk in private with the other person(s) involved.
- During the discussion, use "I" statements ("I feel" not "you did"). Actively listen to the other person with your full attention. Check in by sharing what you heard along the way to verify that you have accurately understood her/him. Communicate to achieve understanding.
- If you feel that safety is an issue, or that the conversation is too difficult to manage alone, seek the assistance of an appropriate, mutually acceptable, third party. The Healthy Congregations Team has members who are available to help.
- Avoid any action that can lead to gossip. Choose your support and help wisely.
- If the conflict is not with the person, but with how that person is performing a job (staff, RE teacher, etc.), address your concern to the Minister if one-on-one discussion does not work or does not feel possible.

In other words, when you feel anxious: Notice, Reflect, Respond directly with the other person. Take a couple of deep breaths before responding to help diffuse high emotions for both parties!

Remember our HCT motto: less judgement, more curiosity!!

Music Corner

As summer begins to wind down, I am looking forward to the fun and collaboration that the fall and upcoming holidays will bring. While things are constantly changing regarding safety measures due the spread of the Delta variant, we can still find ways to share the important connection that music provides.

The possibility of live streaming our services is opening new avenues in ways to connect. This year has allowed me to share music experiences by artists that we would otherwise have not been able to hear. This has been particularly powerful as we have opened ourselves to listening to the authentic voices of those who have been silenced for too long. We will be able to continue to offer these authentic moments by being able to share live video during our in-person and at-home service experiences once our hybrid model begins.

This is not at all to diminish the powerful and important experience of hearing the voices and instruments of our own UUCGT community. Just like all of you, I long for the time of congregational singing and our All Music services. Unfortunately, we are not there yet. For the time being, the recommendation of all major choral and band associations and the UUA is that in-person singing continue to be restricted to smaller, masked groups that meet for a short period of time (30 mins) and are spread 6 feet apart, even if everyone is fully vaccinated and even while outdoors.

The Vocal Ensemble will be able to meet in-person for rehearsals and recordings to be used in our services, but will need to follow these safety guidelines. I will be purchasing "singing masks" that will allow extra room for moving your mouth while still trapping the necessary particles. The Vocal Ensemble and all music offerings during services is heartily open to all. The same guidelines will apply to any and all musicians wishing to utilize the sanctuary. I ask that all rehearsals and performances be scheduled and organized through me so I can make sure everyone is able to have a fun and safe experience.

I look forward to seeing how our new technology allows for even more ways to connect and grow as a musical community and I thank you all for your patience, support, and resilience during this time of creative reimagining.

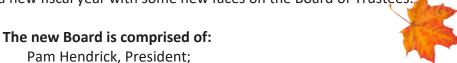
