NORMA TURUY

This is Norma Turuy, a 15 year old Guatemalan student who we sponsor as a congregation. Our sponsorship means she and her family receive free health care, visits from the school social worker, school supplies for all the children of the family, and food, if needed. The sponsored children receive Christmas gifts from us, and a birthday gift. Norma and her family live in San Rafael, a very small agricultural village. They are fortunate to own land, and they grow vegetables and raise geese and other animals. We have sponsored Norma since she was 8 years old.

We raise funds for Norma with the help of Oryana, our local natural foods co-op. They give us 4% for Norma for the gift cards we purchase. Several members regularly shop at Oryana, and just three families provide almost half of Norma's monthly sponsorship. Some spend \$300 a month at Oryana, and because they buy the gift cards ahead of time, Norma's fund receives \$12.00. We are hoping to expand our fundraising, so if you, or someone you know shops regularly at Oryana, please consider purchasing gift cards. Mary Van Valin purchases them for us once a month.

May is "Member Appreciation Month" at Oryana, and there is a discount offered, making our card purchase May 1st a great time to help Norma's fund!



WHERE THE MOUNTAIN MEETS THE MOON Grace Lin

Suggested reading for families/parents this month:

This month, I am suggesting a lovely read-aloud book for families as a follow-up to Harry Potter. This book is filled with "magic, adventure, friendship, and even a dragon who can't fly!"

"Where the Mountain Meets the Moon" by Grace Lin

A Newbery Honor Book

"In the Valley of Fruitless Mountain, a young girl named Minli lives in a ramshackle hut with her parents. In the evenings, her father regales her with old folktales of the Jade Dragon and the Old Man on the Moon, who knows the answers to all of life's questions. Inspired by these stories, Minli sets off on an extraordinary journey to find the Old Man on the Moon to ask him how she can change her family's fortune. She encounters an assorted cast of characters and magical creatures along the way, including a dragon who accompanies her on her quest for the ultimate answer.

Grace Lin, author of the beloved <u>Year of the Dog</u> and <u>Year of the Rat</u>, returns with a wondrous story of adventure, faith, and friendship. A fantasy crossed with Chinese folklore, <u>Where the Mountain Meets the Moon</u> is a timeless story reminiscent of <u>The Wizard of Oz</u>. Her beautiful illustrations, printed in full-color, accompany the text throughout. Once again, she has created a charming, engaging book for young readers."

Family Ministry & the Future of Faith Formation: As I mentioned in my article last month, we have been in conversation regarding some interesting and exciting developments in the world of Family Ministry, UU Faith Formation, and Lifespan Experience. In mid-April I reached out to registered families with more details regarding these ideas, as well as with an invitation to gather to discuss their thoughts on some of the innovations being considered. These innovations would include having all ages together in Sunday Services more often, offering more resources and materials for parents and families to engage in UU learning in their homes, and offering more UUA curriculum courses for adults.

As we look to this idea of Family Ministry as part of the Lifespan Experience, I welcome the input of parents and families in terms of what they need to feel supported in our community. There are several things that I would like for us to consider together: How can we best help you engage in faith formation as families, and what tools/resources might assist you in doing this? What services might we offer that would truly be helpful to you, rather than just one more thing to do? How can we support you as families and important members of the community? At this time, we don't have enough folks able to attend the proposed lunch conversation following service on May 6th, and look forward to getting that rescheduled. In the meantime, if you are a parent or guardian with thoughts relative to these questions and ideas, I would be happy to meet with you as your schedule allows.

Social Justice

Spring is coming but that also means winter is dying. Up here one never knows. New members of our society are being born, and older ones are dying. The newer ones need good food, shelter, education, opportunities. Also the school year is ending and summer time vacation will begin for the kids, and many adults, too. I am amazed though, how we as a society spend our money. I am in a position now to have learned it first hand and the differences are stark.

I work at Blair Elementary in the Blair / Grawn area of greater TC. It is far from a wealthy school area! Many of the kids, if not most or all, get free lunches and also are offered breakfast. Many go home with backpacks of food for the weekends. Many are given publically donated coupons for boots and winter coats. That is all very good! It is needed!

But there is no access to a library in the summer time, no program to stimulate them, or a free bookmobile going around the neighborhoods. They used to have the school library open on some evenings but few kids came. How could they get there? Who could bring them? There are a few volunteer teachers who participate in a book club during the summer that meets regularly. Kids are given the books to read. Some participate. As far as I know, I am the only volunteer in the whole school.

This is an amazing school though! The teachers are above average, extremely kindly and very caring! The office secretaries are mom substitutes. The principal is a loving, kindly guiding hand to all the kids and with many of the teachers, too. The janitorial staff is also involved and supportive to the kids, helping with lost items, whatever. The atmosphere is one of constant loving kindness. But where is the money to boost the many needs, help with transportation, accessories in the classrooms, aides, etc.?

At the other end of living, is the dying. We all go there. The county owned Pavilions are a wonderful set of gradient housing to meet the needs of the aging. They are well managed and seem to really do their job with compassion. But have you looked at the cost? \$4000 a month generally for most facilities, and if you need the nursing home, \$9000 per month per person. Other facilities, public or private, charge the same. Who can afford that? Most who enter there cannot pay \$9000 a month for very long. So the elderly person goes on Medicaid, and the whole family loses their savings. Who pays for Medicaid? You and I.

That is a very large amount paid for the dying?

We are a society that no longer puts our elderly, incapable of functioning dying persons, out on the mountain tops for Nature to take. So we spend \$9000 a month. What about the next generation which has great needs for healthy foods, good education, shelter, etc. How are we spending our money for the future of our nation? Tell me what you would want. Can we change it? Balance it differently?

My sweet good dog has developed a vestibular dysfunction and has great trouble walking, no longer wants or is able to eat or drink. What options are open for her? What can I do to ease her pain and sorrow over her loss of functioning? Tell me. What are my options in helping my dog? Or, in helping the dying elder infirmed? And how should we spend our money? What choices can we make? When?
