Chapter 14

1. In Romans, Chapter 14:1-12, Paul advises the members of the ancient church in Rome that they should accept other believers and not start arguments with them about their understanding of right or wrong. He also asks the members why they believe they have the right to condemn other believers for their understanding of the Good News. How should Christians apply Paul's advise today? How should you apply it?

Chapter 15

2. Here, Paul begins to close his letter to the Romans with the commands to be considerate of others, be patient, and be accepting of each other. He then turns to his plans to visit Rome and Spain after taking the offering he has collected from the churches in Greece to Jerusalem. He was concerned about going to Jerusalem (verses 30-32), but he went, and this set in motion his arrest, and we believe, his death. Why did he go? Did the trip to Jerusalem make sense, since Paul knew he would be in danger? What would you have done?

Chapter 16

3. The Letter to the Romans concludes with a warning against people who cause divisions in the church and a doxology (Chapter 16:17-27). What is a doxology? What are three important things you have learned from the Letter to the Romans?
