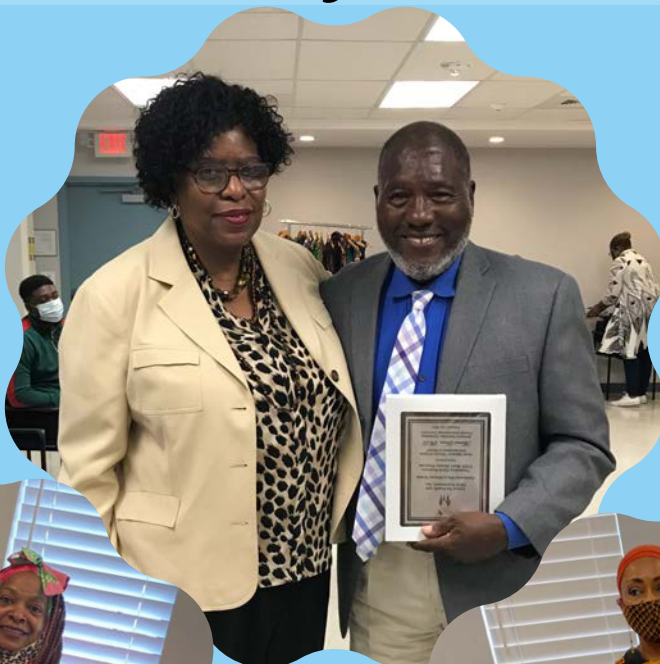

# Board Member Spotlight



## **Rev. Dr. Fernie Johnson** *Director*

In this quarter's Board Member Spotlight, we highlight Rev. Dr. Fernie Johnson who joined the Board of the Center for Child and Family Enrichment (CFCE) nearly seven years ago.

Rev. Johnson is a consumer board member who serves on the Resource Development Committee. He links faith-based organizations to CFCE, promotes program awareness and encourages others to raise funds to support the mission of CFCE.

"CFCE has great programs that help the community in so many areas" said Rev. Johnson. Currently, he serves as a Chaplain with the City of Miami Gardens Police Department and a mentor with the 5000 Role Models of Excellence Project.

As a 5000 role model mentor, Rev. Johnson provides at-risk boys with alternatives to distract them from those things that could lead them into a life of crime and violence.

Rev. Johnson began his career as a teller at SunTrust Bank and retired as a bank manager after 32 years. Since retiring in 2013, he joined his brother in ministry as the Associate Pastor of the 93rd Street Community Baptist Church. Rev. Johnson praises God for any opportunity to serve and he is most proud of the outreach work being done by his church. He recently accompanied members from his church to CFCE's quarterly Pastor's lunch. Before leaving, they made a public pledge to support CFCE in its efforts to increase foster parent recruitment in North Dade.

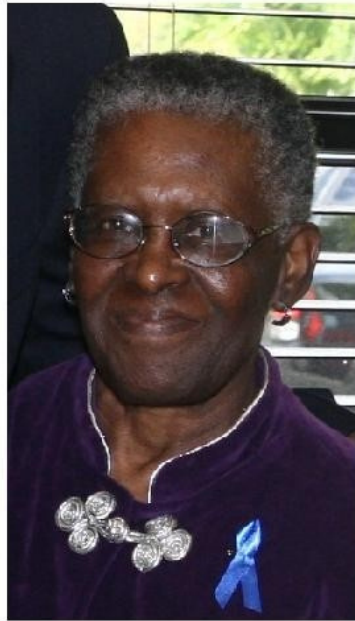
Rev. Johnson has received numerous accolades. He served with distinction as a counselor at the Miami Dade Corrections T.G.K. Facility for ten years with the assistance of Elder Marietta Freeman. He was nominated as Florida Finest by the late Gov. Lawton Chiles for his services mentoring Miami Dade County Public School students with learning disabilities. Most recently, he was recognized as an Outstanding Leader by Miami Dade County Commissioner Jean Monestime.

Rev. Johnson has five daughters and six grandchildren. After graduating from Miami Central Senior High School, he attended Miami Dade County Community College, but went on to obtain his Bachelor's degree from Bethune-Cookman College. He later went on to Jacksonville Theological Seminary where he earned a Master's degree in Christian Education and a Doctorate of Divinity.

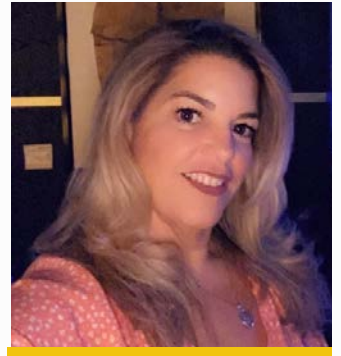

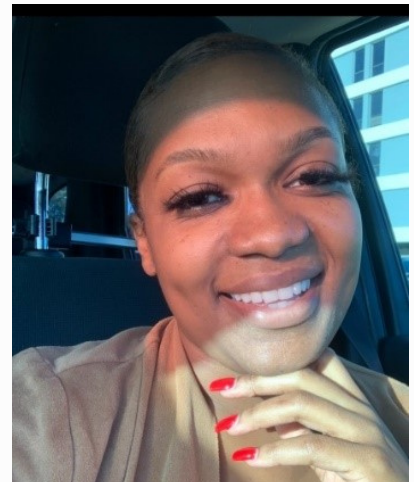

# CFCE Partners with Citrus FCN and the Circle of Brotherhood

Citrus Family Care Network (FCN) has joined forces with the Circle of Brotherhood and the Center for Family & Child Enrichment (CFCE) to boost its efforts to locate loving foster homes for youth in care. At a recent press conference, CFCE President/CEO T. Delores Dunn stated that "[t]he number of foster homes in the Northern areas of Miami-Dade County has steadily declined, . . . We want to ensure children can remain in the communities in which they grew up close to relatives and support systems."

"As the local child welfare agency, it is our job to find innovative ways to address the needs of our community,"

said Esther Jacobo, Director of Citrus FCN. Foster parents can provide safe, loving and temporary homes for children and teens who entered the foster care system through no fault of their own after suffering abuse, neglect or abandonment." "We're calling on everyone to play their part," said Brother Lyle Muhammad Executive Director, Circle of Brotherhood."
