- NOTE: Market Projects validated in June for the Fall 2026 season are still validated for the Spring 2027 season if there are no changes (*IF TLBA/TGBA TAGS ARE ADDED, THE PROJECT MUST BE COMPLETELY REVALIDATED!!*)
 - Breeding Sheep and Breeding Goats (including wether dams & wether does) roll over validation for three years, they do not need to be validated every year.
