

I-25 South Gap Construction

The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) is improving 18 miles of Interstate 25 between Castle Rock and Monument. Improvements include one new Express Lane in each direction, wider shoulders, updated bridges, new wildlife crossings, new pavement and modern technology. The cost of the project is \$350 million. Substantial completion of the project is expected in late 2021 with toll collection beginning in 2022.

Current Construction Activities

Frontage Roads: While frontage road improvements are not part of this project, drivers can expect some impacts on them. To accommodate the wider highway, crews are laying new fiber and improving drainage along the entire 18-mile corridor. For that work, drivers can expect one-lane flagging operations to continue from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. intermittently Mondays through Fridays throughout the duration of the project.

While CDOT has not advertised frontage roads as an alternate route during construction, many drivers are still using them. The project team continues to encourage motorists to "stay the course" on I-25, since two lanes will remain open in both directions during the day. Thank you for your patience!

I-25: Between Plum Creek Parkway and Sky View Lane (Tomah Road), crews are working in the median where the new Express Lanes and wider shoulders will be built. Please watch for trucks frequently entering and exiting the highway. Thank you for driving safely!
