May 16 - June 27, 11:45 AM





Our Rhythms of Renewal class has me thinking of the first poem I ever wrote.

I was fifteen years old, and I was in love with Jillian Aufdermaur. She was cool, smart, big brown eyes, vintage graphic t-shirts, on the swim team. So I imagined she always smelled like chlorine and shampoo, like she got to be Summer year-round while the rest of us seemed frozen in some wintery pubescence. But here's the thing. My entire freshman year I never once spoke to her. Not one time. But somewhere in my hormone-charged, romanticized brain I decided to write her a poem. I spent nights stringing words together as awkwardly as I did everything else at that age. In keeping with my personality, I then asked a friend to deliver the poem to her.

He did. I think. To tell you the truth, I don't even know. He said he did.

Nothing happened. May rolled around, school let out and we all disappeared into our own worlds. Even after we returned to school those worlds continued to spin in their separate orbits. Jillian and I never spoke. At least for a while.

But that taught me something valuable about poetry (that I'm still learning). Sometimes you put it out there and nothing comes back. And that's okay. To quote one of my favorite films, "Sometimes nothin' can be a real cool hand." Because the nothing is silence and that kind of silence can be a cool hand, a gift even. The poet Wendell Berry captures this when he writes,

*Accept what comes from silence.
Make the best you can of it.
Of the little words that come
out of the silence, like prayers
prayed back to the one who prays,
make a poem that does not disturb
the silence from which it came.*

I love that...poems and prayers not disturbing the silence from which they came. Of course there is something communal and noisy about poetry and prayer, but I tend to think at their heart both are solitary, both born of silence. And we need silence. Perhaps the silences we need the most come from the un-answered-ness of things, like unanswered poems, prayers, questions, letters, and phone calls. No one likes being left unanswered, but that kind of silence might strengthen us in ways answers cannot. After a while, we may get to hear a prayer prayed back to us or even find the courage to speak whatever little words came out of the silence.

Which reminds me. It took a couple of years, but I finally talked to Jillian. I even got to be her date to our Senior Prom.

I'm not saying that's an answered prayer.

But it is damn near poetic.

MOBILE EUCHARIST

On Saturday, May 15, you may pick up blessed wafers in the church parking lot. We will provide you with up to ten blessed wafers per person. A liturgy will NOT be provided at this time. We encourage you place the wafers in a Sacred Space in your home and to consume a wafer as you watch the livestream service at 10:30 on Sunday.



We will also ask you to complete a brief survey to help us determine how to provide blessed wafers for those who need them at home. Depending on the need, this may no longer be with a monthly Mobile Eucharist.

To participate, please follow these instructions:

1. Come on Saturday, May 15, between 3:00 and 4:00 pm.
2. Enter from the Georgia Street side of the church parking lot.
3. Drive toward the corner of Lowndes Hall nearest Bryan Street and I-40.
4. Wear a mask over your mouth and nose.
5. Tell the volunteer how many wafers you need. Accept a brief survey.
6. When the volunteer brings an envelope with your wafers, hold your hands outside the window in order to receive the envelope from a distance. If you have completed the survey, please hand it to the volunteer. Or, you may mail it to the church office.
7. Exit onto Bryan Street.

WHAT IS PENTECOST?

(The following facts about Pentecost were made available by Living Discipleship, and are used with permission.)

It's a feast day:


- The Feast of Pentecost, which falls fifty days after Easter, is when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit among the apostles, described in Acts 2.
- The name comes from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth."
- Pentecost is one of the 7 principal feasts of the Church year. (The other six are Easter, Christmas, Epiphany, Ascension, Trinity Sunday, and All Saints)
- On the day of Pentecost, we celebrate the Holy Spirit, which inspired and empowered the followers of Jesus to do the work of Christ in the world after Jesus had ascended into heaven.
- The liturgical color for the day of Pentecost is RED, to represent joy and the fire of the Spirit.

It's a season:

- The Season after Pentecost encompasses all the Sundays from the Day of Pentecost until the end of the church year.
- This long season after Pentecost is also sometimes referred to as Ordinary Time (because we count the Sundays using ordinal numbers— Third Sunday after Pentecost, Fourth Sunday after Pentecost etc.)
- The liturgical color for the Season after Pentecost is GREEN. This is a season for growth, a reminder that the long walk of faith isn't always highs and lows but is made up of the stuff of everyday life.
- The Last Sunday after Pentecost brings us to the end of the church year.

It's "the birthday of the Church" - Pentecost is regarded as the birthday of the Christian church, and the start of the church's mission to the world.
