THE NEW ROTA

We started using new Ministry Scheduler Pro software the week of August 8, 2021. We have had a few issues, but it is going well.

This new software allows us to schedule all our ministries by date, time, and place. We can send an email to each volunteer about a week before each new scheduled period. The next schedule will begin August 29, 2021 and run to October 31, 2021. We will send you a preliminary schedule before the new dates begin. If you need to find a substitute or request a change, please do so as soon as possible. We hope to have the final schedule emailed to everyone by August 25th. Changes can still be made after that date if necessary. About 6 days before you are due to serve you will be sent an email reminder and about 60 hours before you are due to serve you will be sent a text reminder. We will no longer send post cards and make telephone calls as reminders.

The new software also gives us the ability to just notify one ministry group of an impending change or need, such Ushers needed for a funeral or email instructions to the Breakfast Teams that we will be serving outside.

The look and feel are different, and I am sure we will have some mistakes, but it will save us countless hours that we can use to better serve our parishioners. It also saves us money from postage.

You should have received an email with a link to the new Ministry Scheduling Pro system that will have your username and temporary password and a link to change your password. It will also have a link to download the MSP app on your smartphone, iPad, or computer.

Please download the software and start using it to find your substitute when needed or to let us know the changes you need to make to your schedule.

If you have any problems with getting it installed or being able to use it, please contact one of us.

MINISTRY FAIR: IF IT IS YOUR MINISTRY . . .

The catechism of the Episcopal Church asks the question “Who are the Ministers of the Church?” and answers “The ministers of the church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and deacons.” In other words, “Who are the ministers of the church?” “We ALL are.”

It is perhaps not surprising then, that St. Andrew’s has a very high-participation parish culture. The majority of our parishioners are very involved in doing ministry within the church, within our community, and in the wider world.

As part of that “total ministry” culture, each year in September, our parish has a “Ministry Fair.” At the fair, different ministry and non-profit groups have tables or booths with decorations and handouts about their work. For instance, we have a group that knits “prayer shawls” for babies and for people struggling with long term illnesses. This group might have a booth that features a couple of shawls that they’ve knitted and pamphlets about their ministry. They would likely also have a sign-up sheet, so that they can connect with interested people.

At this Ministry Fair each year our people are encouraged to ask themselves the question “What is my ministry?” Getting to talk to representatives from the different ministries and nonprofits helps each member discern the answer to the question of where they will devote their time, talents, and treasure in the upcoming year.

This year’s ministry fair will be held from 6:00 - 8:00PM on Wednesday, September 8th in our St. Andrew’s courtyard. Join us at 5:30 for Holy Eucharist/Holy Unction in the children’s chapel.

BELOVED COMMUNITY "PARTNERS IN EDUCATION" WITH MARGARET WILLS

The first thing to say is "Wow, St Andrew's!". Your donations of school supplies and checks were so beautifully generous! The students of Margaret Wills Elementary are going to feel very loved. Delivery of the supplies was met with lots of gratitude from Principal Elliott and her staff. During our maiden attempt to gather school supplies, we were able to solicit and accept the donations of school supplies for 300 students.

Consider the remarkable gift YOUR generosity has given to these students, staff and families of Margaret Wills. These gifts make a difference. YOU have made a difference. For many families and teachers, getting enough supplies is difficult, for some it may be impossible. But this year, these 300 students have what they need to begin the school year. We will do further drives and more requests for money donations later in the school year.

This small, but mighty group, began as a book club responding to the Black Lives Matter movement and has been reading and discussing high interest books that involve the struggle of many American Christians. This includes systemic and individual racism along with the socio-economic and education disparities in Amarillo. After months of research and consuming information, it is now time for action. Social action that we know can serve to improve and empower the people in the neighborhood around St. Andrew's. We came up with the idea of sponsoring a school with a diverse population as a way to serve the community. Margaret Wills was recommended to us as St. Andrew's School already has a Weekend Backpack Service Project there.

We now intend to make this an ongoing "Partners in Education" project with a three year commitment. We hope to continue to act as a volunteer PTA (VTA).

There are opportunities to serve the students and staff of Margaret Wills aside from the supply of donations and monetary giving. We also need donations to provide support (cards, snacks, gift cards) to the teachers, and volunteers to work in the school as a volunteer tutor and help in the classrooms. Here is the link to Register as a Volunteer in Amarillo AISD. Then all you need is a driver's license when showing up at the school.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Dear Church Community:

Each Sunday it takes a great deal of coordination and cooperation for us to properly serve our Church Community. Our staff, our clergy, and all our ministries spend hours preparing to come together on Sunday to "Worship, Serve, Teach and Pray" together. It is a time of "Love, Beauty, Hospitality, and Inclusivity". It is a time to share our gifts, including financial, with the church.

Additionally, the clergy, staff and volunteers plan all the events and additional services like: "Truckin at St. Andrew's", weddings, funerals, and other services related to the Church. We have numerous ministries and volunteers who provide services at other times besides Sunday that are equally important.

THANK YOU TO ALL OF OUR WONDERFUL VOLUNTEERS AND TO OUR EXCELLENT STAFF. WE ALL LOVE OUR CLERGY, WHICH INCLUDES PRIESTS AND DEACONS. LET THEM KNOW.

As of July 31, 2021, we had a total of \$567,947.39 that had been pledged. The Finance Committee had set a goal of \$678,000.00 in pledges during the planning time in November of 2020. The estimates and goals were made based on prior years averages with an increase of 5% for 2021. As you can see, we were short in reaching our pledge goal by approximately \$120,000. The Finance Committee also estimated that contributions and other non-pledged income would be \$135,250.00. The expenses were estimated to be \$916,255.00, which still leaves us about \$100,000 short, which would be taken care of by a loan to the church by the Trusts. At the end of July, we were approximately \$16,895.00 under budget on actual pledges and \$22,500 under on contributions and other non-pledge income. Expenses for the year are approximately \$87,000.00 under budget for the first 7 months. We had to borrow from the Trust due to the under-budget numbers and the cash flow. Our controllable expenses still are on or below budget. We are being good stewards of what we are being given. The Finance Committee and the Vestry reviews all the finances at the end of each month and adjusts items as needed.

We will be starting our stewardship season for 2022 soon, please be prayerful about your commitment to God and St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.
