New internships are consistently added to our website. **Program Eligibility:** •Undergraduate and graduate students actively attending an accredited college or university are eligible to participate in this program. •Students must have at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) at the undergraduate level at the graduate level. •A college transcript is required as evidence of GPA. Camp Possibilities (715) **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY - Medical Staff.** Credentials sought: RN, CDE, NP, M.D. (preferably with a concentration in diabetes but not necessary). Camp Mission: The mission of Camp Possibilities is to enrich the lives of children with diabetes through the camp experience. Dates: The dates for 2020 are Saturday, July 25th – Friday, July 31st (July 25th is Location: Camp is held at Ramblewood in Darlington, Maryland (www.ramblewood.com). staff training). The ideal commitment is for the whole week however we ask anyone interested to please be able to commit for at least half of the week – for example Sat-M/T or T/W-F. Responsibilities: Members of Medical Teams: Medical teams consist of one team leader and one to two additional team members. Each team maintains primary responsibility for approximately 10-15 campers and/or counselors-in-training under the age of 18. Each member of a medical team practices solely within the scope of her training (nurses, nurse practitioners, physicians, etc.). The duties of medical team members include: 1. Review blood sugars and dose insulin at breakfast, lunch, and dinner. 2. Review blood sugars and dispense snacks at bedtime. 3. Dispense non-insulin medications to campers and staff under age 18. 4. Review blood sugars and respond as needed throughout the day (e.g. to manage hypoglycemia, hyperglycemia, and ketones). 5. Provide medical supervision during camp activities (e.g. swimming, fishing, field games, etc.). 6. Manage non-diabetes-related medical issues (e.g. illness or injury) within the scope of practice. 7. Assist campers with pump-site changes if experienced in this. 8. In general, most medical team members are expected to take on-call duties for one night at camp. Medical team members can expect to work between approximately 7:45 am and 11 pm each day, plus one night on-call. If a medical team member is not available to carry out his/her duties (for example, because she needs to leave campus or is post-call), he/she must ensure that her other team members are aware of her absence. Team Leaders: Team leaders are responsible for all prescribing of insulin at camp, and must have prescribing authority in Maryland. Camp policy recommends that new medical staff in their first year at camp should not serve as Team leaders, even if they have prescribing authority. If a Team Leader is not available to carry out her duties (for example, because she needs to leave campus or is post-call), she must ensure that her other team members are aware of her absence AND arrange for adequate coverage from another Team Leader or the Camp Medical Director. Team Members: Team member responsibilities are detailed above. In addition, for many team members, one goal of coming to camp is learning how to make insulin dosing decisions under the authority of the Team Leader. Ages of campers: 8-17 years of age.
