Gabriel was hospitalized with an abscess in his leg and was unable to work for three weeks. Fortunately, his mother was able to come to help him with his five children. At the request of his social worker, Angel Interfaith Network helped with winter clothes for the boys, food certificates, and a one-time payment to keep the lights and gas on until Gabriel could get back to work!

Baby Alice was born prematurely and her mother was not prepared for her arrival. Angel Interfaith Network was able to help by providing a car seat and a baby basket with clothing, diapers and all the other essentials to keep little Alice warm and comfortable as she begins her life.

Isaias not only lost his wife **Rosario** to cancer, but lost his job as he cared for their 14-month old son and stayed close to her bedside. His social worker asked Angel Interfaith to provide diapers, toddler clothing, food certificates, and rental assistance. Father Joshua was asked to pray with the family. It is wonderful to be a part of the team who provides the support a family needs at a time of loss.

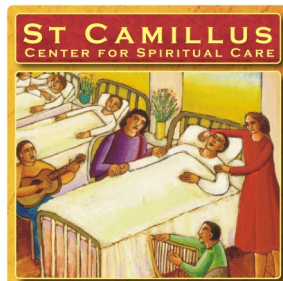

- School uniforms that allow children to attend classes.
