Purchasing a 4-H market animal is a wonderful way to fill your freezer with nutritious meat to feed your family. Buying 4-H is so much more than just meat, it is about supporting the youth, our future, and fostering a program that provides youth with leadership and communication skills that will build them into strong community members. If you are a business you can talk with your tax advisor about the advantage of buying 4-H!

**Fill Your Freezer** with local, quality meat! Buy 4-H at the 2020 Livestock Sale. Due to COVID-19 and gathering restrictions the 4-H livestock sale will be offered online via Montana Cattle Connexion (MCC) for a 2 day sale. We are so excited to be able to provide a sale catalog for you to preview all of the quality animals being offered this year. The lot numbers shown in the catalog will correspond to the lot numbers on the MCC auction.

#### How do I find the Sale?

#### How do I register as a buyer?

Register as a buyer through the MCC website link above. When you reach the Cascade County Fair Sale page click on the blue "Buyer Registration" button and enter applicable information. Don't worry – it's easy to register. You can register as a buyer starting today! Registration closes Saturday, July 11 at noon. There will be a "Practice Lot" available from Sunday July 5 until Friday July 10 that you can use to get familiar with bidding controls.

#### When is the sale?

Sale opens Friday July 10 at 5:00 am. First lot offered closes at 5:00 pm Saturday July 11. The final lot will close at approximately 7:00 to 8:00 pm. Just like a live in person auction the bidding can be fast paced as each lot finishes.

#### How does the auction work?

The entire auction is online. Register as a buyer up until Saturday, July 11 at noon. Preview the animals offered for sale any time after July 4 on the MCC website where 4-H members will post descriptions, photos and videos of their project animals. The lot numbers online correspond to catalog lot numbers. When sale opens on July 10 you may bid on any available lot. All animals will be sold on a per head basis instead of per pound rate. There are 2 ways to bid: Buyers may "proxy bid" where you enter an initial bid amount and a maximum bid amount. Then the computer system bids for you only if someone bids against you up to your maximum. Buyer may "quick bid" where they actively bid against each other, one increment at a time by clicking the bid button on the website for the lot currently selling. A buyer may also "quick bid" after a "proxy bid" maximum has been exceeded.

The sale lots close sequentially with a couple minutes between each lot similar to a live auction. Lot 1 will close then lot 2 and so on. Lot 2 will NOT sell ahead of Lot 1. Lots will stay active as long as bids are being placed. If a bid is placed within 60 seconds of closing the timer will extend another 60 seconds. This extension will push ALL lots back. A lot will not close until there is no bidding activity and the timer expires. Any Buyer can bid on any Lot at any time before it closes.

#### What happens after I purchase?

Invoices will be emailed to successful buyers at the conclusion of all lots. Buyers can pay with a check or through PayPal (with a 4% card fee). Payments must be made by Friday, July 17. A delivery and processing surcharge will be added to each lot to cover cost of delivery of animals to processing facility and harvesting of animal. Carcasses will be delivered to butcher of your choice for cut and wrap with individualized instructions. Butcher instructions will be collected by MCC at checkout from each buyer following the sale.

#### What can I expect for yield of meat?

You are purchasing a live market animal through the auction. The animal weights will be listed on the online sale lot. Once the animal is purchased you are responsible for the processing of the meat. The Cascade County 4-H Livestock Leaders coordinate harvest of the market animals through Vandevanter Meats in Columbia Falls. After harvest the carcasses will be delivered to your butcher from the list provided for custom cut and wrapping. This is an approximate yield of meat for each species:

#### **Butcher Information**

The Cascade County 4-H Livestock sale is a terminal sale for market animals. Market beef, goats, sheep, and swine are entered into a carcass contest and will be harvested at Vandevanter Meats in Columbia Falls. Market goats, sheep, and swine will be harvested on July 13 and market beef on July 14, 2020. The carcass contest will occur on July 15, 2020. Market beef, goat, sheep, and swine carcasses will be loaded onto a refrigerated truck and brought back to Cascade or Teton County butchers to be cut and wrapped on July 16, 2020. The buyer of the market animal has the choice between the following butchers:

If you choose not to use the butchers listed above, you will make your own arrangements for cutting and wrapping. The buyer must understand that by selecting a butcher other than the ones above that the buyer accepts full responsibility for all arrangements with Vandevanter Meats at (406) 892-5643 to pick up the carcass by Friday, July 17, 2020 or make other arrangements directly with Vandevanter Meats. The buyer also is responsible for any concern regarding quality, quantity, timeliness, payment, or any other possible outcome. Buyer is also responsible to pay for shipping cost of meat outside of Cascade County.

Meat pens will be sold at the livestock sale and do not compete in the carcass contest. Buyers will take home meat pens live. The Cascade County 4-H Livestock Leaders will make arrangements between the buyer and seller after the sale for pickup of the meat pen. Buyer is responsible to pay for shipping cost of animal outside of Cascade County.
