The Cross...



Jesus Christ was put to death on a cross, apparently bringing an end to His life and ministry. But because of His death, He made it possible for us to be forgiven of our sins and go to heaven when we die. Jesus died “so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil—and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death” (Hebrews 2:14-15).

The hands open to the cross...



The hands (which creatively double as the eye slits of the helmet) represent our prayer and worship as we lift up the Lord as well as our work as the hands and feet of Jesus when we serve our community.

The Shield...



At Bracken, our goal is to equip and help nurture our students' faith. The Helmet...



When a soldier suited up for battle, the helmet was put on last. It was the final act of readiness in preparation for combat. A helmet was vital for survival, protecting the brain, the command station for the rest of the body. If the head was badly damaged, the rest of the armor would be of little use. Ephesians 6:7 instructs us to put on the whole armor of God and to “take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.”
