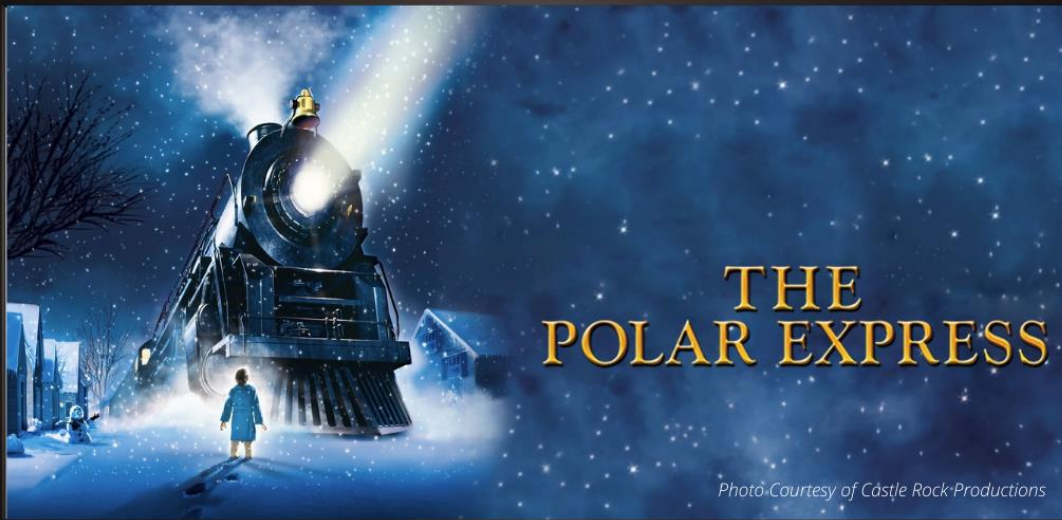

Lighting of the Advent Wreath/Call to Worship

We adorn our sanctuary today with symbols of Advent and Christmas.

Today marks the beginning of a new church year.

Purple, the color for penitence and royalty, is used to mark the seasons of Advent and Lent, the times of preparation before Christmas and Easter.

We light the first candle of the Advent wreath, which is purple and symbolizes hope.

It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ.

We wait in expectation and anticipation for the coming of the Messiah.

The people of Mexico and Central America call the brilliant tropical poinsettia plant the "Flower of the Holy Night."

This beautiful plant symbolizes of the Star of Bethlehem.

Evergreen wreaths and garlands are a symbol of things that last.

With the Christmas tree, we remember God's everlasting promises to the poor and needy...

Today, we decorate this tree with Chrismons which are symbols and signs of Christ to remind us of Christ's identity, God's story, and the Holy Trinity.

We long for Christ to come again and bring light to our world.

The Word of the Gospel is that Jesus Christ lives among us, bringing truth and light as a present reality.

We worship as those who have a glimpse of that reality, and we long for its fullness. We are those who labor to make Christ's light more visible on earth.

Let us praise God, that the light of Christ shines on in the darkness, which has never overcome it.

To God be the glory in Jesus Christ and in the church forever and ever!
