- **Restrooms** are in the Dogwood Lobby, just outside the Sanctuary.
- If you are visiting us for the first time, you are invited to stop by the **Welcome Table**, located in the Narthex. Someone from the Outreach Committee will be there to assist you with any questions you may have.
- **Children are welcome** to be a part of worship, depending on where they – and their parents – find them to be most comfortable:
