Our younger students started the school year off by drawing a self portrait and designing their own mask! We have recently spent our time learning about how lines and shapes can be used in art. We learned about some of my very favorite artists like Yayoi Kusama and Romero Britto. With Thanksgiving right around the corner we will be covering 16th century painter Giuseppe Arcimboldo as well as the career path of a food stylist; students will be given the opportunity to "play" with their food.

Our older students started the school year off learning a little bit about anatomy and human proportions. With this knowledge they took on the instagram challenge "Meet the Artist," where they drew a picture of themselves in their own style surrounded by things that represent them. In the spirit of fall, 6th grade learned perspective and created One Point perspective pumpkins by blending oil pastels. The 7th and 8th graders have been spending their time in the art room learning about relief sculpture. They are creating their own low relief portrait of someone who inspires them.
