FOR UNDOCUMENTED LGBTQI IMMIGRANTS**

About the Levin-Goffe Scholarship for Undocumented LGBTQ Immigrants

Due to rising tuition and student loan interest rates, college degrees are more expensive than ever. Even so, undocumented LGBTQI immigrants experience increased challenges in their pursuit of higher education due to social stigma and legal discrimination levied against them.

The Levin-Goffe Scholarship for Undocumented LGBTQI Immigrants provides critical financial support to students who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or intersex, and who are living in the United States without permanent or otherwise secure residential status. It offsets some of the financial burdens undocumented immigrant students face and helps advance the dreams of LGBTQI community leaders. Specifically, the scholarship covers up to two years of undergraduate schooling at an accredited New York City college or university, paying tuition and fees of up to \$6,250 per term or \$12,500 per year directly to the scholarship recipient's school.

Who Should Apply

Eligible applicants are all those who:

- Self-identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or intersex (LGBTQI);
- Self-identify as an immigrant;
- Are undocumented*, i.e., do not hold U.S. citizenship, a green card, and/or a F-1 visa, and are not an international student;
- Can prove full-time enrollment at an accredited, nonprofit New York City college or university with intention of receiving a bachelor's degree;
- Have successfully completed at least one full academic year at a New York City college or university, or are at least a rising sophomore at a New York City college or university;
- Do not have a tuition that exceeds \$12,500 annually; and
- Have a current, most recent, or cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or higher**

*“Undocumented” is defined as foreign-born U.S. residents who do not have documented permanent residential status. We also welcome applications from individuals seeking or already granted asylum in the United States.

**Renewal of this scholarship requires that recipients maintain a GPA of at least 3.25 each term.

***International students, defined as individuals enrolled at an accredited higher education institution and in the United States on a temporary visa for the purpose of undergraduate study, who are not immigrants or refugees, are not eligible for this scholarship.**

Scholarships will be awarded on the bases of both need and merit. Candidates should:

- Have a clearly expressed need for financial support;
- Have and be able to maintain an excellent academic record; AND
- Demonstrate interest and involvement in their school and/or local community

Note on applicant confidentiality: The privacy and safety of applicants for the Levin-Goffe Scholarship is an intrinsic component of the process. All responses provided herein will remain confidential and be shared only with staff of the Stonewall Community Foundation and members of the Levin-Goffe Scholarship Selection Panel.
