

In Fiscal Year 2020-2021, First 5 San Joaquin invested over \$14 million in programs and services aimed at increasing the number of children ages 0 to 5 who are ready for school. The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the reach and services of First 5 San Joaquin funded programs during this fiscal year. While a pause on in-person services led to a decrease in the total number of people served, programs also pivoted to offer virtual or expanded services to meet families' urgent needs. This summary highlights the characteristics of families served by First 5 San Joaquin, as well as the services provided by its funded programs.




First 5 San Joaquin funded programs served children throughout San Joaquin County, with the **greatest number of children living in Stockton** (95206, 95205, and 95207)

Enhance Early Learning

First 5 San Joaquin invested in programs that help children succeed in school.



- **400 children** ages 3-5 participated in a quality half-day preschool program
- **148 children** participated in a five-day kindergarten bridge program
- **1,085 children** participated in Raising a Reader, a program that encourages families to read together and connect to community resources
- **7,300 children** participated in Read to Me, Stockton!, a program that provides free books to children ages 0 to 5 in Stockton
- **98 childcare providers** participated in IMPACT 2020, a program to enhance the quality of early learning environments

Improve Child Health

First 5 San Joaquin invested in programs to improve the health and well-being of young children.



- **798 children** ages 0 to 5 received dental services or oral health care coordination through the San Joaquin TEETH program
- **2,032 children** received a screening for developmental delays, and **208** of those children received a special needs referral
- **896 children** were connected to at least one service through the Help Me Grow Call Center
- **288 children** received a screening or an intervention for a special need from the Great Beginnings program

Strengthen Family & Community Support



First 5 San Joaquin invested in programs that strengthen the ability of families to provide for their children's physical, mental, and emotional growth.

707 parents with young children received weekly home visits focused on child development, family self-sufficiency, job skills training, and/or healthy eating and physical activity

2,895 parents of children ages 0 to 5 contacted the 2-1-1 Call Center to access services in San Joaquin County

176 parents with young children received housing assistance through the HousingWORKs program
