Characteristics of Families Served


Fiscal Year 2017-2018



In Fiscal Year 2017-2018, First 5 San Joaquin invested over \$9 million dollars in programs and services aimed at increasing the number of children who are ready for school. This summary highlights the services provided by First 5 San Joaquin funded programs as well as the characteristics of clients served.

Who First 5 San Joaquin Served


Children and families across the county were served, with the greatest number of children served in **Stockton** (95206, 95207, and 95205)



In **2017-2018**, over **19,000** children, parents, and providers were served, compared to approximately **17,700** served in **2016-2017**



Children served by First 5 San Joaquin were **ethnically diverse**





First 5 San Joaquin invests in programs that help young children to succeed in school.

- **883** children participated in a half-day quality preschool program
- **887** children participated in a one-week kindergarten bridge program
- **1,504** children participated in Raising a Reader, a family book bag exchange program
- **1,676** children participated in Read to Me, Stockton!, a program that gives books to children ages 0-5 who live in Stockton
- **83** providers participated in *Raising Quality!* IMPACT, a program to ensure high-quality systems of early care and education, and as a result, **2,131** children in their care were better prepared for kindergarten

Strengthen Family & Community Support

First 5 San Joaquin invests in programs that strengthen the ability of families to provide for young children's physical, mental, and emotional growth.

- **801** families received weekly home visits focused on their child's development, their family's self-sufficiency, and/or their family's healthy eating and physical activity
- **1,548** parents accessed services in San Joaquin County through the 2-1-1 Call Center
- **116** families received employment skills coaching through the CalWORKs Helping to Enhance Parent's Potential (CalHEPP) program



Improve Child Health



First 5 San Joaquin invests in programs to improve the health and well-being of young children.

- **1,049** children received care coordination and/or dental services through the San Joaquin TEETH program
- **3,047** children received a screening for developmental delays, and **303** of those children received a special needs referral
- **577** families were connected to at least one service through the Help Me Grow Call Center
