- September 15: Do We Have a Prayer? – Why do we pray, individually? Together?
- November 17: Anti-Semitism, Part 1 – What is it? Where does it come from?
- December 15: Anti-Semitism, Part 2 – How it works in our world today? What can we do about it?
- January 12: Special Guest Teacher !! Rabbi Joe Domosh – The *Halacha* of Grand-Parenting: Your Rights And Responsibilities To Spoil Your Grandchildren Under Jewish Law
- This class will share modern perspectives of the traditional role of the grandparent in the life of the grandchild while navigating your changing relationship with your children. The grandparent's role will be discussed. as it is so very important in the development of a well-rounded "Mensch" of a grandchild.*
- February 9: *Tikkun Olam* – Where did the idea of "Repairing the World" come from, how has it evolved since first appearing in the 1500s, and how did a fringe idea come to inspire much of the Jewish world?
- March 9: The Gifts of the Jews – What are the greatest contributions Judaism has made to the world? And what does the world think about those gifts?
- April 6: What Did Judaism Get Wrong? – How do we understand such *Torah* teachings as "putting rebellious children to death," "an eye for an eye," and the permission to own slaves?
- May 4: Why do Bad Things Happen to Good People? – A Compendium of Jewish Answers

Please also keep in mind the numerous other opportunities to engage in life-long Jewish learning, as Rabbi Sultar teaches and leads discussions at virtually every *Shabbat* evening and morning service, as well as during the *chaggim*/festivals, and at the beginning of every Board meeting (open to all CBJ members)
