chevron donates \$12 million to assist local communities during COVID-19 crisis

Chevron has a long history of supporting communities, particularly in times of need by contributing to crisis response and relief efforts. To date, we have donated \$12 million to COVID-19 relief efforts across the globe.

United States initiatives

- Chevron donated to foodbanks in California, Texas, New Mexico, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia to support the distribution of emergency food.
- Chevron has donated \$500,000 to DonorsChoose's *Keep Kids Learning* initiative, which provides teachers across the U.S. in highest-need schools with grants to purchase essential supplies for students who are now out of school. Local business units are also donating funds and equipment to provide meals and technology to students out of school.
- In our home state of California, we donated 100,000 surgical masks to local hospitals.
- Chevron-funded Fab Labs are aiming to produce over 20,000 face shields and masks for hospitals, nursing homes and first responders.
- We've given to efforts to support local businesses, including the Greater Houston COVID-19 Recovery Fund in Texas and the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce in Mississippi.
- Chevron is distributing \$1 million in Chevron gift cards to first responders and food banks in seven states.
- Through the Chevron Humankind employee matching grant program, we donated \$2 million to 1,300 U.S.-based non-profits in April.

International initiatives

- Chevron has donated funds to support emergency food needs and medical services in 17 countries, including Angola, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Kurdistan region of Iraq, Indonesia, Nigeria, Kazakhstan, Panama, Philippines, Saudi Arabia, South Korea, Thailand, and Venezuela.
- In Argentina, Chevron has donated generators, water tanks, computers and printers for relief efforts.
- In Brazil, Chevron donated funds to build a field hospital for COVID-19 patients.
- Chevron donated to the Royal Flying Doctor Service in Western Australia, which supports medical services in remote areas including aboriginal communities.
- Chevron is leading an industry-wide coalition to assist Nigerian healthcare workers.
- In Kazakhstan, Chevron donated ventilators to a children's hospital in Almaty, and donated \$2 million in medical supplies for Atyrau health providers and \$250,000 to Columbia University to assist the Kazakhstani Ministry of Health.
- In South Korea, Chevron donated 10,000 facemasks to first responders and healthcare workers.
