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“Stand Up” Virtual Choir Camp

NEW CHORAL COLLABORATION CELEBRATES THE LEGACY OF HARRIET TUBMAN AND UNDERGROUND RAILROAD IN THE BRANDYWINE AND LEHIGH VALLEYS
The Bel Canto Youth Chorus of The Bach Choir of Bethlehem and The Choir School of Delaware Present One-Week Choral Intensive Featuring Music from the Movie “Harriet”

The Bel Canto Youth Chorus of The Bach Choir of Bethlehem and The Choir School of Delaware are excited to co-present “Stand Up” Virtual Choir Camp August 17-21. Inspired by the Harriet Tubman story and the geographic ties to the Underground Railroad of the two organizations, the camp will provide opportunities to develop cultural competency through music, art, and storytelling. Students will explore rhythm, harmony, improvisation, and vocal technique, as well as the artwork of Jacob Lawrence's book, *Harriet Tubman and the Promised Land*. The week will culminate with sharing of creative projects and singing the Cynthia Erivo song “Stand Up,” from the movie, *Harriet*.

Through artistic expression, the virtual camp will create a safe environment to build empathy and understanding of people from differing backgrounds. Students will engage in meaningful discussion about the historical context of Harriet Tubman, the Underground Railroad, abolitionism, and representation of Black culture in American society.

This program is a collaborative effort between the directors of the two organizations. Dr. Joy Hirokawa, Founder and Artistic Director of the Bel Canto Youth Chorus, will lead music rehearsals and infuse meaning into the lyrics. Arreon A. Harley Emerson, Director of Music and Operations at the Choir School of Delaware, will delve into the themes of Lawrence's book as they pertain to the music, using historical context and art to examine tropes and representations of the Black experience in American culture. Brittney Lynn Stanton, Choir School of Delaware's Director of Education and Assistant Conductor, will provide instruction in musicianship inspired by Dr. Hirokawa and Mr. Harley's lessons.
