Below is a list of our shelter clients' specific needs:

A Working, Single Mother of Two Seeking Stability

- Needs stable housing for herself and two daughters (ages 11 and 16), up to \$1200 in rent.
- Needs help securing a reliable car, as her current one is no longer functional.

A Mother of Four with Special Needs Children

- Looking for housing (up to \$2000 in rent).
- Eviction on credit is a barrier and needs help removing it.
- Seeks mentorship programs and support for children with autism.

A Single Father Seeking Affordable Housing

- Looking for an affordable apartment for himself and his teenage son.
- Seeks a positive neighborhood to help them work toward a better future.

A Single Father of Two Seeking Stability After Loss

- Needs an apartment within a \$1900 rent limit.
- Looking for affordable programs for his daughters, particularly in soccer and art.

A Mother of Seven Seeking a Fresh Start

- Needs affordable housing (up to \$2300 in rent).
- Has an eviction on her credit and seeks understanding landlords or programs.

A Young Mother Seeking Stability

- Seeking affordable housing for herself, her one-week-old baby, and older child.
- Recently moved to California for better opportunities.

A Single Woman Starting a New Job and Seeking Stability

- Looking for an affordable apartment or room (up to \$1200 in rent).
- Recently secured full-time employment and needs stability.

A Single Woman in Need of Affordable Housing

- Needs an apartment she can afford (up to \$1500 in rent).
- Has a stable job but needs help finding a home.

A Mother of Three Seeking Affordable Housing

- Looking for housing for herself and her two children (up to \$1500 in rent).
- Has a stable job and child care in place.

A Mother of Six with Section 8 Seeking Housing

- Transferring Section 8 voucher and seeking housing in Oceanside or Vista.
- Has a job and needs affordable housing for her family.
