


The Virgin Way by Richard Branson

<p>What is it?... A medium length book (400+) pages, structured into 4 parts each one covering one of the Leadership keys - Listen, Learn, Laugh and Lead. Spread over 19 chapters. The narrative is written in a very conversational style, packed with anecdotes sharing with readers some of the things he's done that worked as a leader, as well as some of his mistakes. The ideas and philosophy are presented through great stories that illustrate just why simple things are sometimes hard to do. The themes are presented to yield insight into the mindset and actions of an author who is radically different from his peers and yet has proven himself to be highly effective.</p>		<p>Why is it worth reading?... To consider that the demarcation lines that any form of elitism creates can only serve to harden the walls of departmental silos that need to be softened not reinforced. To learn the of orchestrated procrastination whereby the first thing to be addressed as part of the decision-making function is timing. To understand the meaning of taking responsibility when crisis arise. To gain insights into how to build a business and the right attitude in doing so, using the support of others. To understand that inspirational leadership is almost impossible if you don't have your head, heart and soul in the business.</p>

Learn – it's not the size of the dog in the fight that matters - it's the size of the fight in the dog 3. Laugh – it's all about culture - keeping employees happy and engaged, means they will keep customers happy who reward us with their loyalty 4. Lead - Be visible, take risks, get creative, make yourself heard and take the fight to them before they bring it to you 		<p>What if.... passion is innate? What if...passion knows passion?
