



4th Annual National CPR and AED Education Day Action Plan

- All learners and instructors will be required to wear a mask (learner provides own mask) covering both the nose and mouth for the duration of the event. **If a learner has a medical reason which precludes him/her from wearing a mask, we kindly ask that they do not attend an in person training on October 17, 2020 but instead take advantage of our free on-line curriculum accessible at www.compressandshock.org.**
- Hand sanitizer will be provided for participants and instructors. This will be provided by the Foundation at no cost to the host facility/learner.
- Learners that did not come together to the training will not be partnered together - i.e. you are welcome to train with your household contacts/friends that come with you but we will not ask learners to share equipment with other learners not already in close-contact with them.
- We will space training groups a minimum of 6 feet apart.
- All equipment will be sanitized after each training session.
- Every learner will be emailed a questionnaire 48 hours prior to the event to ensure that they are healthy and have not had any known COVID exposure prior to the training.
- We ask all host facilities to grant us the largest possible space for our training and to open any exterior doors as feasible.
- Every learner upon completion of his/her training will receive a plastic bag with two disposable masks and 1 pair of gloves to keep with him/her in case they need to perform CPR (gloves and one mask for the rescuer/ one mask to be placed on the victim). This will be provided by the Foundation at no cost to the host facility/learner.
