## **Grant Us Your Peace**

I remember Miss Barbarossa, my second-grade teacher at Benjamin Franklin Elementary School, Park Ridge, IL. We made balloon paper mâché turkeys, props for a play we performed for our parents. (Ask John about 'Kevin', the church-appropriate version.) I remember Miss Rolf teaching us a poem entirely of prepositions so we could identify prepositional phrases while diagramming sentences. (I can still recite it!) I remember the first music round I learned: *Dona Nobis Pacem*, Latin for 'grant us peace'.

The *Dona Nobis Pacem* text is usually listed as a traditional liturgical text, as notated in our Glory to God hymnal, #752. It originates from the Agnus Dei section of the Latin mass, where it is used as an invocation to the Lamb of God to have mercy on and grant peace to the worshipers. Believed to have been introduced into the Mass by Pope Sergius I in 687, the last phrases of the Latin form are *Agnus Dei*, *qui toltis peccata mundi*, *miserere nobis* . . . *dona nobis pacem* (Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us . . . grant us peace).

In preparing this edition of *Music Corner*, I discovered Ralph Vaughan Williams' cantata, *Dona Nobis Pacem*, written in response to the possibility of a second European conflict and reflects on the theme of peace. The work includes poems by Walt Whitman, passages from the Old Testament, concluding with text from the Gospel of Luke: *Glory to God in the Highest and on earth peace, good will towards men*.

Most Sundays we conclude our worship singing, 'Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me,' reminding us of our 2025 congregational challenge and commitment to invoke, embody, and share the peace of Christ.

It gives me joy to share a childhood melody and text to which I have returned repeatedly for moments of calm reflection. Thank you, Tracey Conrad and Tammy Mott, for gifting us with a lovely flute setting of *Dona Nobis Pacem*, a tune beautiful in its simplicity and its petitioning text.
