Detroit, Ypsilanti, Pinckney, South Lyon—A Local Musician

This Sunday, 14 September, prelude, communion, and postlude music are the works of composer Anthony Giamanco, born in 1958 in Detroit.

Like me and so many children in the 1950s, Anthony began piano lessons at age 8. Unlike me, Athony started composing a few years later. He attended Eastern Michigan University where he studied voice, piano, organ, and composition. After Eastern, he did several things to support himself, typical of most musicians who have a job that pays the bills so one can do what one really loves: make music.

In 2000 Anthony took his first full-time music position at Shalom Lutheran Church in Pinckney where he developed a vibrant music ministry, including adult and children's choirs, a handbell choir, brass ensemble, and a contemporary band. At this time, he also sang in and became assistant director of the Livingston County Chorale, which performed several of his choral pieces.

Although he continued composing organ music, his desire to write for the piano grew. He began creating supplementary pieces for his students as well as composing hymn settings and original sacred pieces for piano, many of which have been published. For years I subscribed to **The Organ Portfolio**, **The Sacred Organ Journal**, and **The Church Pianist**, bi-monthly collections published by the Lorenz Corporation until mid-2020 when COVID decimated the demand for church music. Lorenz now offers the work of composers and arrangers in monthly collections, available online, as digital downloads. Lorenz introduced me to Anthony's work. I enjoy his versatile style thoroughly and appreciate that some of his work is easily adaptable between instruments.

His compositions, performed throughout the U.S., Europe, and Asia, have won him recognition and awards. In researching Anthony this week, I discovered *Organ Music for the Christmas Season*, a collection of six compositions from around the world, published by Tim Knight Music (UK). Anthony's *Masters in This Hall* was chosen for inclusion in this anthology. I am looking forward to learning his clever rendition as a gift to all of you during this year's Advent season. Anthony currently lives in South Lyon, where he continues composing and arranging. I am grateful for Anthony and all who continue to compose and inspire me.

We are recognizing Mark Douglass, Aviation Maintenance Administration Man / Petty Officer 2nd Class, US Navy, Viet Nam



Mark Douglass was born November 24,1947. He was the first of 4 boys for Edwin and Berice. Mark was very mechanically-minded and grew up working on lawnmowers, cars, and engines with his dad. After graduating from Taylor Center High School, he followed in his dad's footsteps by joining the US Navy in 1965. Mark was given the rank of Petty Officer 3rd class during boot camp at the Great Lakes Training Base in Illinois. After graduation, he was stationed at Naval Air Station (NAS) Memphis for Aviation (AZ "A") School.

Mark's next assignments included Log and Records with Fighter Squadron VF-174 at NAS Cecil Field in Jacksonville; Maintenance Control aircraft deployments to Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Yuma and NAS San Juan; working on the flight deck and in the office on Attack Squadron VA-82 on the USS America (CVA-66); Global Logistics Support VR-62 in Pensacola where he flew Lockheed Hercules C-130, earned Aircrew wings, and worked as a Load Master loading personnel, starting up, weighing, and balancing the aircraft. Mark flew into Saigon, Viet Nam to fairy personnel to Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines in 1968. Soon after, he left the Navy in November 1968.

Mark's next step in his career took him to Ford Motor Company in Dearborn where he held the following positions: Clerk for the Sheet Metal Shop in Research and Engineering; Crib Attendant in the Electrical Maintenance Shop; and the Hazardous Storage Yard.

Mark rejoined the Navy in 1982 at Selfridge Air National Guard Base in Mount Clemens, working in the Maintenance Control Area. Mark's next assignments included the 0472 Naval Air Facility (NAF) Diego Garcia for 2 years; the USS Independence (CV62) during the Persian Gulf War in 1990; the NAF Lajes 0473 in Azores, Portugal; and HazMat Coordinator for the base on his active-duty weeks and on the USS America in 1994. He earned his title as an Enlisted Warfare Specialist and retired from the Navy in 1999 with 20 years of experience. In 2007, he retired from Ford after 40 years with the company.

Mark enjoys bowling, traveling, working on his 1965 AMC American Convertible, and helping his friends with construction and other projects. He was in three movies as an extra - Top Gun, Navy Seals, and Message in a Bottle. Mark participates in reunions for his Navy Unit at Cecil Field -VA-174 and is also a member of the Livonia Veteran's Connection. He is very proud of his family's military service to this great country.
