IT'S TIME FOR THE SUPER BOWL OUTREACH PRAYER VIGIL!

We're asking for volunteers to sign up to pray for one hour between 6pm Friday, January 30th and 6am Sunday, February 1st. During this time, volunteers from the SOAP Project (Save Our Adolescents from Prostitution) will be going from motel to motel delivering missing children posters, bars of soap, and makeup wipes with information and the hotline number for victims, as well as with information cards for housekeeping and front desks on signs to look for and what to do if they suspect human trafficking.

The prayer vigil is held one weekend before the Super Bowl, which is an event that increases trafficking three-fold, based on a study conducted over the last 23 Super Bowl games.

Please consider signing up to pray for one hour during this time. Pray where ever you find peace, quiet and comfort. Some ideas of things to pray for can be found on the table outside the Chapel. Sign-up sheets will also be on the table outside the Chapel. Thank you for helping us fight human trafficking one bar of soap, one wipe, one poster, and ONE PRAYER at a time.

JOIN US IN HONORING OUR VETERAN OF THE MONTH

We are recognizing Douglas Andridge, Seaman, U.S. Navy Reserve

Doug was inspired to join the Armed Forces by his Dad and Uncle Bob, who served as officers during WW2 and received Bronze Stars. His Uncle Wells, who was a career Navy person, peaked Doug's interest in the Navy. He grew up visiting all the different ships that his Uncle Wells served on and he thought it was very interesting. Doug decided to join the Navy when he was a junior in high school after learning of The Navy Reserve program that required 1 year of weekly drills, then 2 years of active service, followed by 2 more years of weekly drills.

Doug began his active service at Great Lakes Naval Training Center in Illinois for 8 weeks of basic training. On his second day of training, he received multiple vaccinations and was then put through 2 hours of PT and could barely lift his arms the next day. Doug drilled with ancient rifles which had no operating parts and were falling apart. During boot camp, Doug received various skill tests, one of which was typing, and he tested at 30 wpm. Because of these test results, he was assigned to office jobs instead of the physical brunt work like swabbing the decks or hanging over the side of the ship to scrape off paint.

Doug's first assignment was in Washington D.C. working in a security section of what was called the "gun factory." After clearing security protocol, he was then assigned to the personnel section of the naval base in Anacostia, MD.

Doug's next and favorite assignment was when he was a member of the payroll department aboard the aircraft carrier USS Forrestal (CVA-59), which was stationed in the Mediterranean Sea at that time. The payroll department was responsible for paying all shipboard crew and the "cag" (carrier air crew) twice a month. During this time, everyone was paid in cash.

On Doug's first day out to sea, he went topside to watch air ops and was overwhelmed and impressed by the jet engines running, the ballet of the air crew readying the planes for takeoff, and the planes being shot off the deck of the ship. The air crew's job was to get all the planes off the ship as quickly as possible, then to bring them all back onboard safely using tail hooks to catch the plane, jerking the planes to a halt while landing at 120 mph on a ship going 35 knots. Then the deck crew's job was to get the landed planes out of the way as quickly as possible so the next plane could land.

While on the ship, Doug had the opportunity to spend Liberty in Naples, Rome, and Pisa, Italy. During his 3 day tour in Rome, he visited the Vatican, saw the Sistine Chapel, and even had an audience with the Pope. He had no idea how venerated the Pope was to Catholics – it was like the Pope was a rock star in front of thousands of people screaming "Viva Papa" with tears streaming down their cheeks.

After Doug's tour with the carrier, he was assigned to Little Creek Amphib Base in Norfolk, VA. During his time there, Doug found it interesting to watch as the SEALS (frogmen) were being trained during Hell Week.

Doug was blessed to have served during a time of relative peace after the Korean War and before the Vietnam War. He enjoyed his time in the service and would recommend that all young people consider serving. Doug was released from active duty in September 1959 and received his honorable discharge on October 10th, 1962. After active duty, Doug returned to Lansing and attended Michigan State University for 1 year. In 1962, he married his wife, Martha, and moved to the Detroit area where he went to work in the architectural hardware industry until he retired in 2006.
