# WORKING FOR IMMIGRANT RIGHTS IN THE TRUMP ERA:

Xenophobia, Solidarity, and Active Resistance within the Labor Movement

### **ORGANIZED LABOR & IMMIGRANTS**

- Long history of institutionalized xenophobia
  - 2001 declaration of inclusion
- 19.6% of private sector workers are foreign-born (EPI)
  - Many overlooked industries, including young people
- Typically focus of labor solidarity
  - Busive comprehensive immigration reform
  - Deportation defense, Know Your Rights
  - Strengthening collective bargaining agreements
- Vocal responses, strategic silences in response to Trump era policies

#### IF YOU GET STOP BY THE POLICE

- 1. IF THE POLICE ASKS FOR LICENSE, REGISTRATION, OR PROOF OF INSURANCE, PLEASE SHOW THEM YOUR DOCUMENTS.
- 2. IF THE POLICE ASKS FOR YOUR IMMIGRATION STATUS, REMAIN SILENT.
- 3. IF HE POLICE ASKS YOU IF THEY CAN SEARCH YOUR CAR. DO NOT CONSENT TO THE SEARCH.
- 4. IF THE POLICE IGNORES VIOLATES YOUR RIGHTS, REMAIN CALM AND RECORD THE INCIDENT. MEMORIZE THE NAME AND BADGE OF THE POLICE AND TRY TO GET THE INFORMATION OF A WITNESS.



### **ATTENTION ICE:** I DO NOT CONSENT TO THE SEARCH OF MY HOME

- I DO NOT WISH TO SPEAK WITH YOU, ANSWER YOUR QUESTIONS, OR SIGN OR HAND YOU ANY DOCUMENTS BASED ON MY 5TH AMENDMENT RIGHTS UNDER THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION.
- I DO NOT GIVE YOU PERMISSION TO ENTER MY HOME BASED ON MY 4TH AMENDMENT RIGHTS UNDER THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION UNLESS YOU HAVE A WARRANT TO ENTER, SIGNED BY A JUDGE OR MAGISTRATE WITH MY NAME ON IT THAT YOU SLIDE UNDER THE DOOR.
- I DO NOT GIVE YOU PERMISSION TO SEARCH ANY OF MY BELONGINGS BASED ON MY 4TH AMENDMENT RIGHTS.

#### WHAT TO DO IF ICE SHOWS UP AT YOUR DOOR

















### IF ICE IS AT YOUR WORK

- 1. DON'T RUN AND REMAIN SILENT.
- 2. DON'T TALK ABOUT YOUR IMMIGRATION STATUS IF ICE ASKS
- 3 DON'T SHOW FAKE IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS.
- 4. ASK AGENT IF YOU'RE FREE TO LEAVE, IF YOU ARE WALK DON'T RUN.
- 5. IF ICE SAYS YOU CANNOT LEAVE, REMAIN SILENT AND IF ICE PERSISTS TO ASKS TELL THEM YOU WANT TO SPEAK TO AN ATTORNEY AND DO NOT SAY ANYTHING



#### **GUIDE: WHEN ICE IS AT YOUR DOOR**

- DON'T OPEN THE DOOR. ICE CANNOT COME IN UNLESS YOU GIVE THEM PERMISSION OR THEY HAVE A JUDICIAL WARRANT SIGNED BY A JUDGE.
- IF THEY HAVE A WARRANT, ASK THEM TO SLIDE IT UNDER THE DOOR/SHOW IT THORUGH
- IF THE JUDICIAL WARRANT DOES NOT HAVE THE CORRECT NAME OR ADDRESS, TELL ICE THAT YOU DO NOT GIVE THEM PERMISSION TO ENTER
- DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS OR TALK TO ICE IF THEY CONTINUE TO TALK TO YOU.
- TELL THEM TO READ THE SIGN OUTSIDE YOUR DOOR INDICATING THAT YOU DO NOT CONSENT TO A SEARCH.
- DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING AND CALL YOUR ATTORNEY.

# KNOW YOUR RIGHTS WHEN INTERACTING WITH IMMIGRATION AGENTS

- Remain silent: "I plead the Fifth and choose to remain silent."
- 2 Do NOT sign anything! You have the right to consult with an attorney before answering any questions or signing any documents.
- You do NOT need to show ID or immigration documents to the immigration agents. If requested, reply by saying, "I wish to speak to an attorney." If you have a valid green card or work permit, carry it with you.
- No law enforcement agent has the right to enter your home without a proper warrant signed by a judge, with your correct name and address. Do NOT open the door without having them first show you a signed warrant.



### **ACADEMIC ORGANIZING PRIORITIZING INTERNATIONAL WORKERS**

- University of Chicago Graduate Employees International Caucus
  - 2018-19: GEO prioritized international worker demands
  - 2020: International Caucus pushed back and agitated when management moved on every demand but that of international workers – and won
- University of California wildcatting grad students
  - 2019–20: fighting for workers threatened with <u>deportation for</u> <u>striking</u>.



### CROSS-CAMPUS ORGANIZING AND TRUMP'S POLICIES

- 2018 Fight against Trump's anti-Chinese policies.
- 2020 Fight against the student ban
- Growth of organizing networks beyond union structures
  - X-Campus Rank and File

### **INTER-IMMIGRANT SOLIDARITY**

STATEMENT ON 7/6 SEVP-ICE GUIDANCE AND RESCISSION

Building upon the work of our undocumented peers in universities, we recognize that it is long overdue for international students to enter the fight for immigration justice. Non-citizens in the US have built lives here: built homes, relationships, and families. International students and other migrants and immigrants are not here to be exploited as pawns in political debates. Although today might be a win for us, we cannot forget others who are suffering brutal attacks by the same immigration system. Even as we speak, the US government is attempting to dismantle the asylum system and accelerate deportations for asylees escaping from life-threatening circumstances. The president has announced his intention to challenge DACA once again in the coming months.

We strongly condemn this nativist approach to immigration, and stand in solidarity with undocumented people and asylum seekers.

s international and undocumented students at Rutgers University, we demand protection from xenophobic legislation, police brutality, and ICE. We urge the Rutgers administration to speak out and reassure its international and undocumented students and workers that Rutgers is on their side. We are not disposable.
