

WHAT TO DO.....WHEN THERE ARE DEVELOPMENTAL CONCERNS



This training addresses questions that arise when child care teachers are concerned about a child's development. How do I know if I should be concerned? How do I talk with the child's parents or guardians about my concern? What services are available for the child and family and how do they access those services?

Training topics will include: using the NH Early Learning Standards; understanding factors that impact children's development, implementing evidence-based practices (Pyramid Model) to support children's development; and screening tools. Come with your questions and leave with a better understanding of what to do when you're concerned about a child's development.
