Training Description: Drowning is the third leading cause of unintentional death in the United States, and the second leading cause of death for people ages 5 - 44. For children ages 1 to 2, drowning is the leading cause of injury/death. (U.S. Lifesaving Association) ***This program examines why and how children drown and what we can do to prevent it.***

Should I take this training? As defined in the New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules- "Water activity" means any activity during which children are exposed to swimming pools, water features, or other bodies of water, excluding water tables, wading pools or sprinklers, whether the children will be swimming, wading, playing or walking in the water, floating or boating on, or otherwise in, on or near a pool or body of water.



