Be the Strategy: Providing Comfort, Support and Protection to Our Children in Emergencies

The Pyramid Model is a promotion, prevention and intervention framework early educators can use to promote young children's social and emotional development while preventing and addressing challenging behavior (Hemmeter, Fox, Snyder, & Algina, 2014). Especially in times of crisis, the Pyramid Model framework with its emphasis on responsive caregiver interactions and predictable, consistent routines, can be an important resource for teachers who need support in their classrooms. The information presented explores how to care for ourselves in times of uncertainty, specific behaviors you may see your children demonstrating during this time and resources to guide them. Come see how the Pyramid Model framework can assist you in supporting your children and information you can share with families to assist them at home.
