Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE)

Failure to act quickly during an active shooter event can leave you in a position to be injured or killed. The faster you decide to take action, the more likely you can save your life and the lives of those around you. **Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE)** Training will help you to quickly decide to take action by **providing a strategy** that develops your situational awareness, **mental planning** and a **common sense approach to surviving an active shooter event**. CRASE is a U.S. Department of Justice-sanctioned training course developed by Texas State University.
