In the morning, participants will delve into ***How to Talk So Adults Will Listen and Listen So Adults Will Talk***. Communicating with staff or families is vital... but can be challenging! Understanding how to communicate and **listen intentionally** allows us to create winning partnerships. Join us to **explore strategies** to overcome barriers to communication to **build stronger relationships**. Discover tips for **enhancing your communication** with other adults and practice techniques for handling tough conversations.

In the afternoon, we will focus on ***Effective Goal Setting, Reviewing Progress and Moving Towards Change***. We will explore lost opportunities that hinder our success and learn coaching strategies to support others in this process. Participants will find **intentional strategies** to support adults to create action steps that become a commitment for change. Learn how to **review progress to combat reluctance**, resentment, and resistance. We will discover the strengths-based approaches to **motivate individuals and empower** them to contribute to the shared vision of the program. Learn how to **create dialogue focused on change** of behavior for future success and accountability.
