We will have time to discuss this new dilemma, discuss strategies for responding, and answer questions.

Diane Levin has her PhD and is a professor of Human Development at Boston University. **Professor Diane Levin's work focuses on how children's development, learning, behavior and play are affected by things such as violence and war, poverty, media and commercialization, and educational mandates and testing.** Diane recommends what we can do to protect children and promote optimal development and learning in relation to each of the societal factors she studies. **Dr. Levin has authored (or co-authored) dozens of articles and eight books, including: *The War Play Dilemma, Beyond Remote-Controlled Childhood, So Sexy So Soon* and *Teaching Young Children in Violent Times*.**
