45th Parallel Universe is thrilled to present Julius Eastman's brilliant masterpiece *Femenine*, a one-hour minimalist meditation on beauty, spontaneity, and community. The program will start with an adaptation of the iconic radio piece "Boys" by Meredith Monk, A WORLD PREMIERE!!

Featuring pianist Darrell Grant, vocalist Bora Yoon, violist Kenji Bunch, guitarist Mike Gamble, and the virtuosos of 45th Parallel Universe, this evening promises to be a remarkable, stirring, and unconventional concert experience.

ABOUT JULIUS EASTMAN:

Julius Eastman (1940–1990) was an African-American composer, pianist, vocalist, and dancer. Eastman grew up in Ithaca, New York, where he began studying piano at age 14 and made rapid progress. He made his debut as a pianist in 1966 at Town Hall in New York City. In New York, Eastman became involved in the avant-garde music scene, established himself as a performer, conductor, and composer, and was associated with some of the most innovative musicians and composers of his time, including Philip Glass, Steve Reich, and John Cage.



Despite his significant contributions to music, Eastman's life was marked by personal struggles and financial difficulties. After he died, alone in a Buffalo hospital at age 49, it took eight months for an obituary to be published.

ABOUT FEMENINE:

The first time I heard this piece I cried. Feminine is beautiful, joyful, and provocative and defiant, just like Julius Eastman. As a jazz performer I can't wait to immerse myself alongside these thoughtful musicians in the emotional sound world of this daringly individualistic Black American composer. - Darrell Grant

Eastman's 1974 work *Femenine* (pronounced feh-meh-NEEN), a mesmerizing 70-minute groove that unfolds one beautiful moment after another. It's a masterpiece of collective, ecstatic music-making.

Even putting the historical significance of Eastman's work aside, *Femenine* is simply great music, an epic meditation on beauty, spontaneity, and community. It's an open score, meaning the players get to choose who's in the band, and also have great latitude in how the piece evolves, with Eastman's 4 page score giving the players very spare direction. The line between composer and performer is moved significantly in favor of the musician, with the result being performances that are utterly original and specific to that moment in time.
