- Travel to Washington D.C. to attend simulated meetings of the African Union: Feb. 21-24 2019
- Attend the 2019 National Model African Union Conference at Howard University

This interdisciplinary undergraduate course allows students to do four things:

- Learn about Africa's major 20th-21st Century Challenges
- Study African Politics in Practice in the Nation's capital
- Participate in a simulated summit of the African Union
- Network with students and faculty from 30 to 40 universities and colleges
