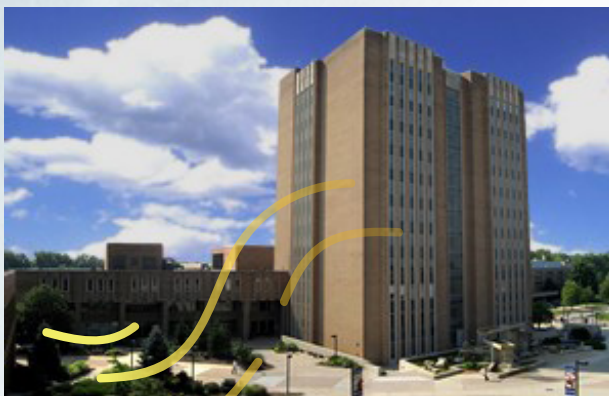
CITATION MANAGEMENT
