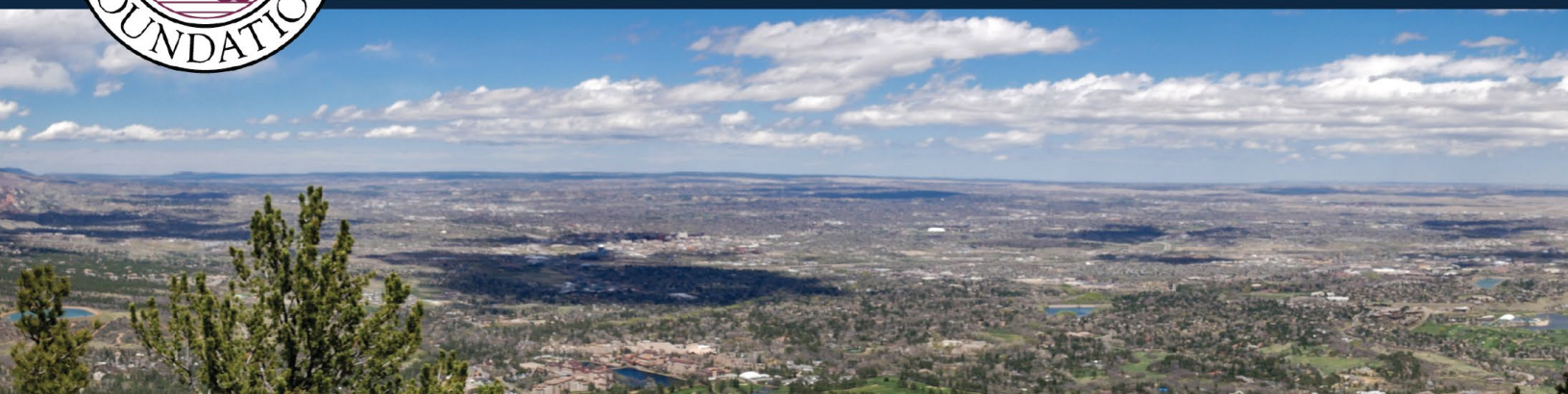

These include Penrose House, Will Rogers Shrine of the Sun and Penrose Heritage Museum. Each provides a distinct experience and opportunity to learn about and connect with the story of El Pomar's founders and their impact on our state.

Over the past 16 months El Pomar's Historic Properties, like the rest of the world, have experienced a variety of operational adjustments, protocols and even long closures to outside guests in an effort to ensure the utmost safety for our staff and stakeholders.
