This week, we:

- Learned about Aseret Y'mei Teshuva, the 10 Days of Repentance, and the three things we can do (Teshuvah (repentance), Tefillah (prayer), and Tzedakah) that have the power to transform us and God's view of us during the High Holiday season.
- Began a new math unit on measurement and used centimeters cubes and rulers to measure length.
- Reviewed what a digraph is and searched for digraphs in a variety of words.
- Continued researching different landforms. Each student learned about how different landforms are formed and some examples of famous landforms found throughout the world.
