Here are some of the things we did this week:

- Worked on three digit division using place value disks
- Shared the work of Langston Hughes, Jon Scieszka, and read animal poetry
- Discussed the word "variable", specifically in relation to the grow tower lighting and its effect on the plants
- Learned about Tecumseh and the Battles in the early 1800's with Britain
- Journaled about our Kabbalat Shabbat program then expressed thoughts with the class about our perspectives
- Chose pieces of learning to share in upcoming portfolios
- Led school tefillah!
- Finished Tar and Sar and started reading a new book
- Listened to a student's experience about going to a presidential candidate's rally, and talked about President's Day
- Learned about the letter aleph and what it indicates from biblical Hebrew to modern day Hebrew
- Worksheets in Tal Am identifying who said what in the Humash and to whom did they say it

- Who was Tecumseh and what did his brother do to go against his wishes
- What was our skit about for parsha at school tefillah

- What do you think was the most interesting tree from Tar and Sar... what are the names in Hebrew for the trees

Ask your 4th grader:

- What part of the Kabbalat Shabbat experience was the most memorable for you
- When sharing with your class about KS, what did you realize
- Why were there so many battles in the early 1800's with the Native Americans, and how were the British involved
- Which tree do you consider to be the tree of life. What did each of the trees provide
- What Hebrew letter indicates "ani" from Humash lesson
- What happens in this week Parsha
