

Boston-born Carr (1915 – 1997) was a pioneering scientist and environmental activist. Best known for her conservation work in Florida, she led a coalition in a battle to protect and restore the Ocklawaha River in the heart of central Florida. Construction of the Cross Florida Barge Canal was intended to connect the Atlantic and Gulf Intracoastal Waterways. Carr, cofounder of Florida Defenders of the Environment, blocked the construction in 1971 prior to its completion on the grounds that the river's health, still imperiled, would be significantly impaired. The project was deauthorized by Congress in 1990. Gather virtually for an overview of Carr's life and legacy.

Magnificent tangled oaks line this neighborhood laced with magnolia trees, orange groves, bird life and butterfly gardens. Mandarin, named after the orange, is nestled along the St. Johns River. Learn about the area's rich history as it has been captured and preserved. The area once served as a primary exporter of cotton and oranges in the 1800s. Olde Mandarin was called "a tropical paradise" by Harriet Beecher Stowe who wintered here from Connecticut for 17 years. Beecher-Stowe (author of "Uncle Tom's Cabin") instilled her spirituality and passion for community and it still lives on. Visit the nearby Walter Jones Museum. Leigh Burdett, owner-operator of e2ride bike tours, is your expert guide. She received a preservation service award from the City of Jacksonville in 2016 for her efforts to celebrate and promote the city's history. Debrief with fellow riders over a Dutch-treat lunch. You ride in drizzle but reschedule for more severe weather. Flat terrain suits all levels of riders. Transportation is on your own. Parking is free.
