Oregon Representative Mitch Greenlick passed away on May 15, 2020 after facing recent health issues. During his almost 18 years of service, he was a relentless advocate for the residents of House District 33 and the State of Oregon, and committed to the principles of justice, fairness, and equity for all.

Joining the Legislature in 2003, Representative Greenlick continued to serve his constituents through the 2020 legislative session.

Through his education and professional endeavors, Representative Greenlick worked diligently to improve the lives of others. With a B.A. and M.S. in Pharmacy, as well as a Ph.D. in Medical Care Organization, he applied his education as a professor emeritus and past chair of the Department of Public Health and Preventative Medicine at Oregon Health and Sciences University (OHSU), as director of the Kaiser Permanente Center for Health Research, and as the Vice President for Research at Kaiser Foundation Hospitals. A prolific writer, he authored over 200 books, chapters and articles sharing his knowledge and insights with others.

Drawing from his education and experiences, Representative Greenlick was a passionate advocate for issues of health care access, education, the environment, and justice. At the time of his passing, he was a member of the Judiciary Committee, Health Care Committee, and Joint Legislative Policy and Research Committee. In prior sessions he served as Chair of the Health Care Committee and Conduct Committee.
