WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE EMERGING ENERGY & ENVIRONMENT ISSUES IN THE WEST?

There are many issues (salmon, for example) that reflect this tension. We will need a wide portfolio of resources, from hydro to fossil fuels to alternatives - each with its advocates and detractors- to find the appropriate balance.

District 24, in Twin Falls County, Idaho is a largely urban area with agriculture on the outskirts of the district.
