One Hundred Volunteers Contributed More than 6000 Hours to the Gilchrist Immigrant Resource Center's Classes in 2020

The Gilchrist Immigrant Resource Center offers free and low-cost classes to the community, thanks to our amazing volunteer instructors and assistants. In 2020, volunteers eagerly and quickly dedicated themselves to learning how to teach online so that we had only a short period of transition from in-person to online classes.

Our 116 volunteers served as teachers in our English and computer classes, teaching aides in our citizenship program, administrative volunteers, and more. Some of our volunteers proposed and implemented program re-designs to best accommodate students, others worked extra time to help people pre-register for the COVID-19 vaccine! The Gilchrist Center served nearly 6,000 immigrants in Montgomery County in 2020, and the work of our volunteers directly impacted more than 2,000 people in the County.

On April 24, the Gilchrist Immigrant Resource Center hosted its annual Volunteer Appreciation Event to celebrate our volunteers who were so crucial to our operations in 2020. In the midst of the pandemic, our volunteers worked harder than ever to ensure that immigrants in our community received the services they needed, in spite of increased challenges, such as technology access for our clients. In this year that was so difficult for all of us, our volunteers contributed more than 1,000 more hours of their time than in 2019!

Our staff were joined by County Executive Marc Elrich, County Council President Hucker, and Councilmembers Katz and Riemer in honoring our volunteers at an online event featuring student and teacher testimonials and live music. We were pleased that family members of Charles Gilchrist -- Mrs. Phoebe Gilchrist, Mr. Jim Gilchrist and Mr. Don Gilchrist -- joined us.

We are immensely grateful for their commitment and dedication to our common goal to make Montgomery County a better place for immigrants.
