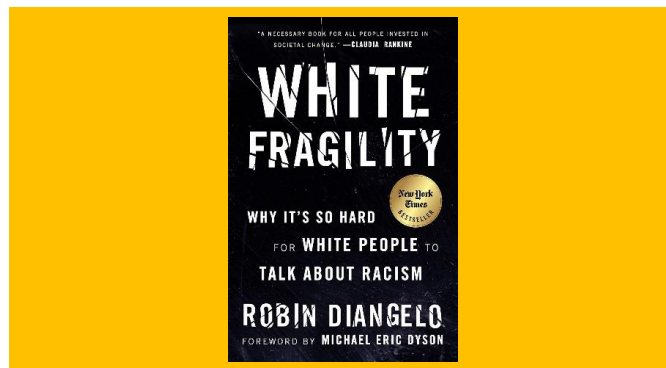




CANDID CONVERSATIONS ON RACE Not Just Another Book Club



The Faith Community Advisory Council's book groups, "*Candid Conversations on Race*", are going virtual with the book, "*White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism*", by Robin DiAngelo. These book discussion groups are being offered for people wanting to delve deeper into their own experiences of racism and to listen to the experiences of others in order to promote racial equity and social justice, here and everywhere.

The conversations will be led by co-facilitators who led the book discussion groups "*Candid Conversations on Race*", held last fall & winter. The co-facilitators are white and African American. People of color are encouraged to participate. These virtual discussion groups will meet at least four times, be limited to 10 people, and held on July 12 & 26 and August 9 & 23 between 7:00 to 8:30 pm, and on your own home computer using Zoom! *Participants must purchase their own copy of the book.*
